## **Analysis**

Analysis:  HB 74 establishes the crime of airbag fraud, making it illegal to knowingly sell, install, or manufacture counterfeit, nonfunctioning, or noncompliant airbags. Enforcement falls within the existing responsibilities for the Alaska State Troopers (AST) for fraud and vehicle-related crimes.
<b>Training:</b> AST personnel are already trained for awareness in fraud-related crimes, and this statute can be incorporated into routine legal updates.
<b>Operational Impact:</b> The bill does not impose additional enforcement burdens beyond existing duties. Investigations of airbag fraud cases can be handled within current resources.
<b>Fiscal Impact:</b> No additional costs are anticipated. AST can implement the provisions of HB 74 within existing operational capacity.
