## FISCAL NOTE

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BILL NO. HB202

### Analysis

This is an indeterminate fiscal note.

This bill would exempt farmers and other food producers from governmental regulation and oversight of the sale of food products if sales were under \$200,000 annually. The distribution of food products without government oversight could result in an indeterminate increase in the incidence of foodborne illnesses and outbreaks. Foodborne illnesses are reported to and investigated by the Division of Public Health. This requires coordination with local public health and environmental partners, including public health nurses, environmental health officers, and laboratory staff. The increased number, scope, and location of outbreaks and follow-up of sporadic reports of illness cannot be predicted. Costs incurred would include staff time, travel, materials (e.g., supplies for specimen collection and analysis), and depending on the illness involved, possibly pharmaceuticals.
