BILL NO. HB 329

Analysis

This proposed legislation makes changes to the exemption for electrical utilities employees working in areas of both small and large population areas. It changes the exemption to be determined by the location of service rather than the company level. There would be no expected licensing requirements or additional enforcement.

No revenue is generated from the proposed legislation and there is no increased spending.
