Senate Judiciary members,

I am writing in support of HB 93, Requirements for Resident Sport Fishing, Hunting, or Trapping License.

I am a resident of Ketchikan and I regularly see charter captains who are functionally non-residents claim residency in order to take advantage of residency fishing requirements. These captains are only present in Alaska for 3-4 months during the summer, and then return to their "real" home state for 8-9 months during the winter, where they work and maintain or own a permanent domicile, all while maintaining an Alaska PO Box or having mail sent to a vacation rental that sits empty all winter.

These are individuals who clearly have no interest in actually being Alaskans. Instead, they simply want to take advantage of a cheaper license and (specifically in Southeast) the ability to kill Kings everyday and ling cod without size restrictions.

Changing fishing and hunting license requirements to approximately match PFD requirements will help ensure that resident benefits are only available to actual residents, and will help prevent the issues that come with out of staters who have seek to take advantage of our natural resources without any interest in actually contributing to the state as residents.
