FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB 104

Analysis

This bill would create an address confidentiality program within the Department of Administration to let certain eligible people use a state-designated substitute mailing address instead of their actual address. The program would be available to qualifying victims of domestic violence, stalking, trafficking, sexual assault, human trafficking and sex trafficking as well as peace officers, correctional officers, and certain household members, with DOA responsible for administering the program, forwarding mail, protecting address records, and adopting implementing regulations. The bill also requires state and municipal agencies to accept the substitute address, allows disclosure to law enforcement only under a search warrant, creates criminal penalties for improper disclosure, and would take effect January 1, 2026.

There is no anticipated fiscal impact to the Department of Public Safety, Alaska State Troopers.
