FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
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Analysis

SB 211 extends statutory authorization for the Board of Professional Counselors to June 30, 2032; the Board of Marital and Family Therapy to June 30, 2034; the Board of Psychologists and Psychological Associate Examiners to June 30, 2031; the Real Estate Commission to June 30, 2030; and the Board of Social Work Examiners to June 30, 2034. Adoption of the bill will allow these boards and commission to continue their existing activities with the administrative oversight by the division. Failure to adopt the bill will result in a one-year wind down of the boards in FY2027, and the division will assume all licensing responsibility in FY2028.

If the bill passes the following expenses will be incurred:

FY2032 costs are reduced by the cost of the Real Estate Commission as the extension of the commission only extends it through FY2030, with FY2031 being the wind down year were the commission not extended in FY2030.

Annual expenditures are estimated at approximately \$269.9 for the Board of Professional Counselors, \$71.4 for the Board of Marital and Family Therapy, and \$196.3 for the Board of Psychologists and Psychological Associate Examiners. The Real Estate Commission projects annual expenditures of about \$537.8, and the Board of Social Work Examiners is estimated at \$307.6. All professional licensing board activities are fully supported by revenue from license fees.

If this legislation is not passed and the boards sunset, the department would continue to require access to expertise in the profession. Replacing the expertise currently provided by volunteer board members with professional service contracts may increase the annual costs of these programs, resulting in increased license fees. No professional licensing board has sunset in recent years, so reasonable estimates of these costs are unknown and would vary by profession.

Professional licensing programs within the Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing are funded by Receipt Supported Services, fund source 1156 Rcpt Svcs (DGF). Per AS 08.01.065, licensing fees for each occupation are set so the total amount of revenue collected approximately equals the occupation's actual regulatory costs.
