

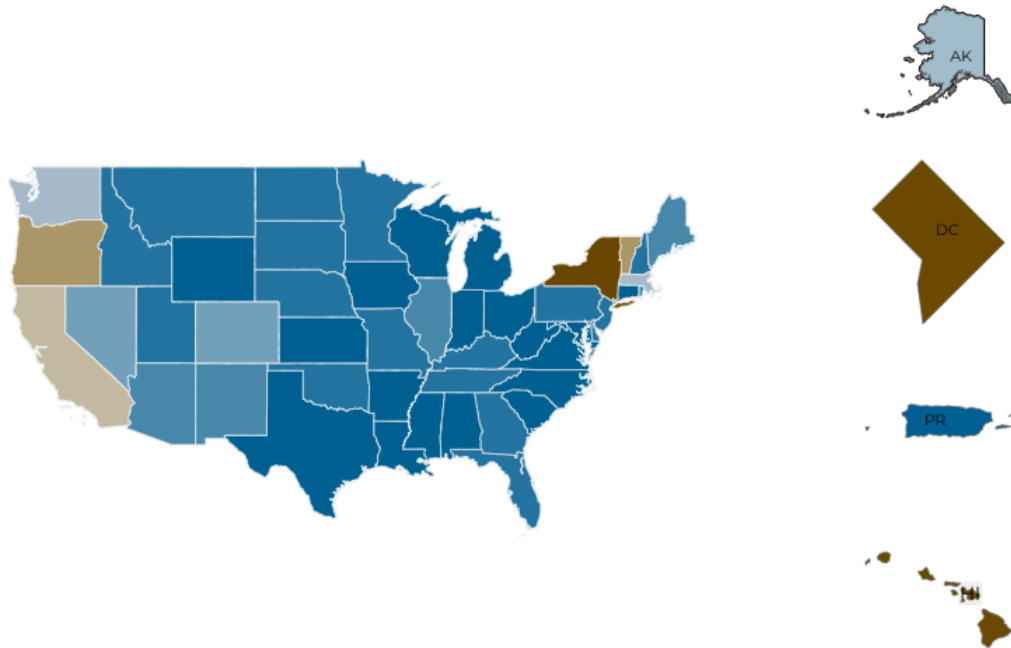
POINT-IN-TIME COUNTS BY STATE

In 2024, **771,480** people or **23** out of every 10,000 US residents experienced homelessness.

19.2% of states (including Puerto Rico and DC) have a rate that is greater than the United States. From 2023-2024, rates of homelessness increased in **77%** of states.

States with Higher Rents Tend to Have Higher Rates of Homelessness

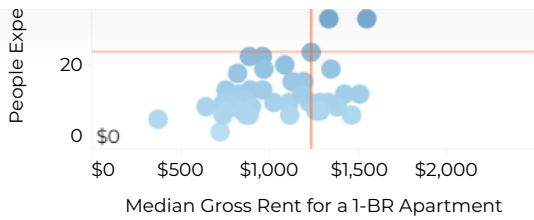
Median Rents Versus Homelessness Rates by State

People Experiencing Homelessness Per 10,000 Residents





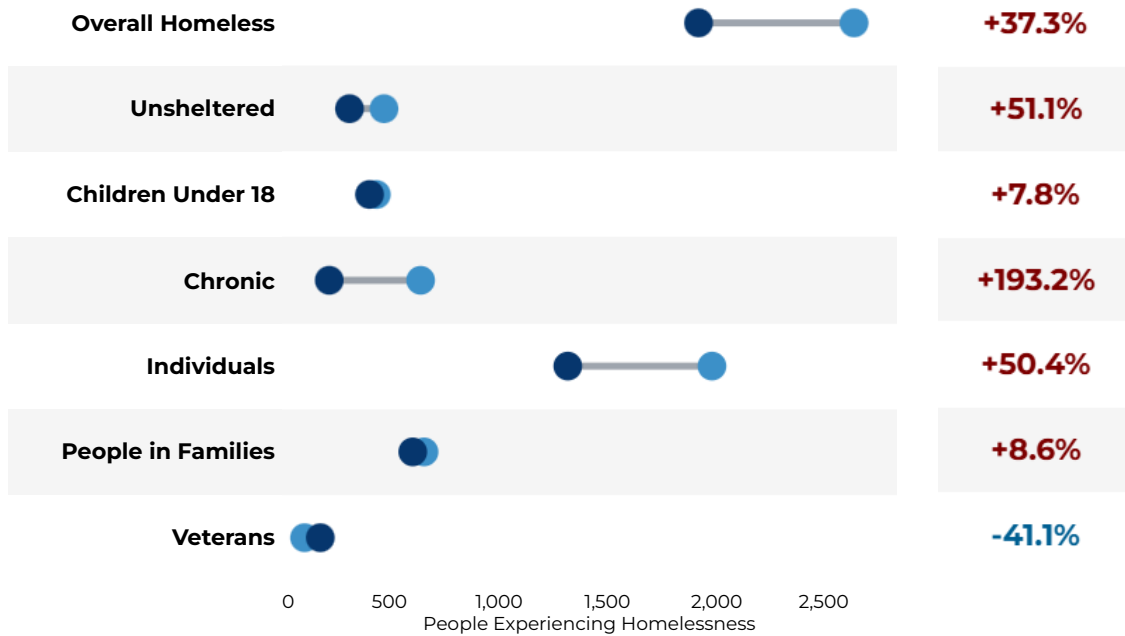

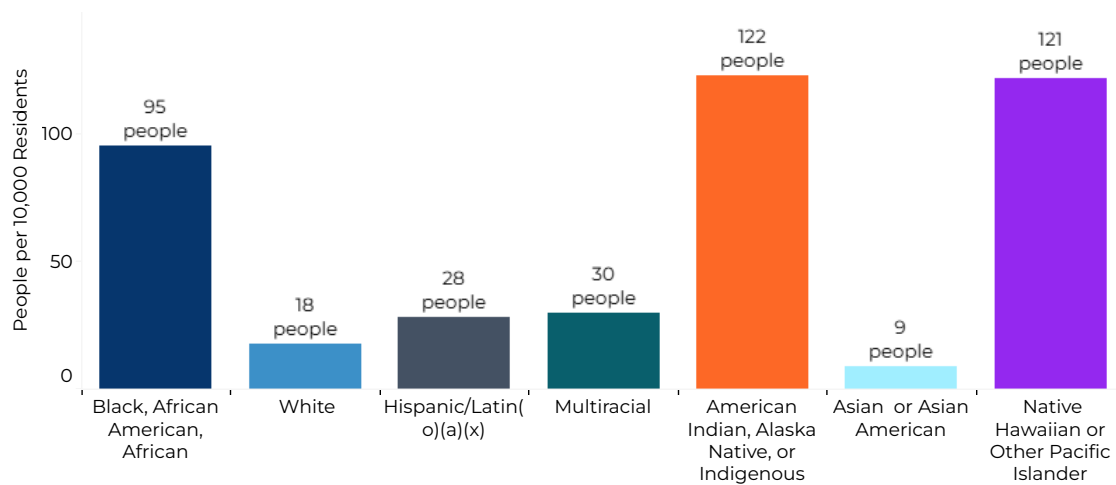

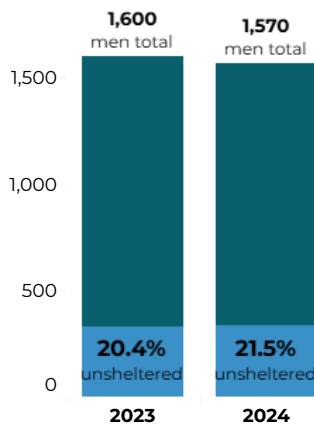

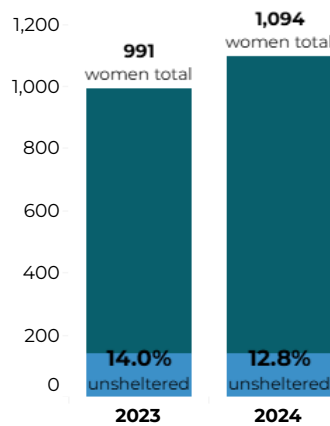

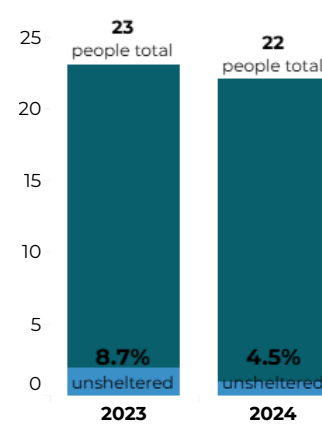

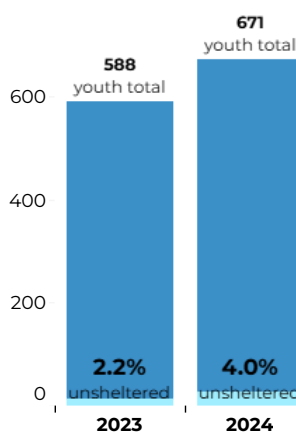

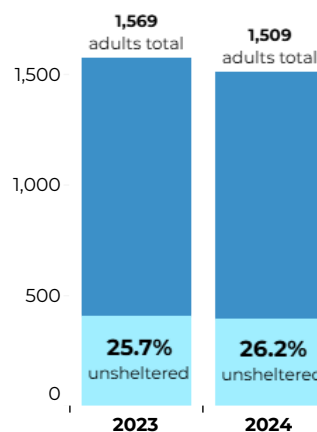
Homelessness by Age Group

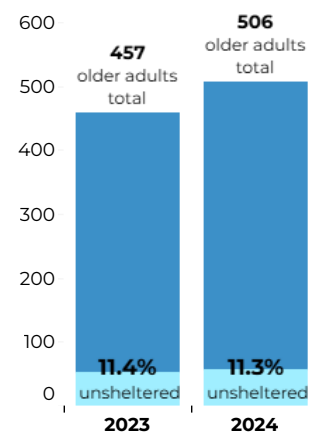
Youth Under 25
