BILL NO. SB 282

Analysis

SB 282 amends the provisions of the Joint Armed Services Committee (Committee), including changes to legislative reporting from annual to biennial, adding an additional civilian member to the Committee, and expanding the Committee's duties to increase collaboration with federal, state and local organizations. The legislation will require the Legislative Affairs Agency to maintain a list of members and their contact information, as well as notify presiding officers of the House and Senate of vacancies and upcoming vacancies of civilian members.

The only direct fiscal impact identified relates to the added civilian member of the Committee, who would be entitled to per diem and travel reimbursement for Committee meetings. These costs are expected to be minimal and anticipated to be absorbed within the current budget.
