BILL NO. SB261

Analysis

SB261 helps unhoused young adults (ages 18–25) obtain essential documents, specifically birth certificates and state identification cards, by easing fees and documentation requirements to demonstrate proof of identity.

The bill does not specifically change any current Department of Health programs or processes and aligns with the Alaska Bureau of Vital Statistics policy of waiving fees for unhoused individuals of any age with accompanying written verification; therefore, this is a zero fiscal note.
