Dear House Finance Committee members:

I write in support of bill 195b, the bill to expand pharmacists provider status.

Initially I had my reservations about this. As a pharmacist for over thirty years practicing in Alaska I never had any ambitions to become a prescriber. I often defer patients back to their primary providers if there are any concerns for their situation.

I can see how this bill would allow more access and eliminate a substantial amount of unnecessary office visits, including emergency room visits. I wish I had a count of how many times my hands have been tied in helping patients with their medication needs that could easily have been resolved with a pharmacist generated order.

1. We are a fishing community. I've had many patients in the past who have not been able to get one more refill that they needed before they had to leave for an opening. I would feel comfortable reissuing one extra refill for a patient to extend a therapy they have been on for years without issue, ie blood pressure, inhalers, diabetes meds etc, and follow up with a note and refill request to their primary provider.
2. We are a tourist destination. Without fail we always have a handful of stranded travelers who have lost or left their medications behind. Due to the time difference in Alaska, and limited Dr. office hours elsewhere it's a huge commitment in time to track an order down and get them taken care of in a timely fashion with respect to our current legal limits. There have been numerous times these patients have had to seek out local help at the clinic or emergency room.
3. We have a migratory community. Seniors often leave for the winter return in the spring. Seasonal workers (fish plant, fisherman crew, charter businesses) arrive in the spring and depart in the fall. This creates many situations in which a prescription is out of refills, or we have difficulty executing the transfer. Acceptance of this bill would help us help them in their transitions.

I can still foresee myself referring patients that are beyond my scope of practice, I can see it as a very useful option for the times I find my hands tied. In turn passage of HB195 would overall not just help these patients, but expedite their care, and overall lower costs.

My name is Catherine Kowalski, and I am a pharmacist practicing in Petersburg, Alaska. I am writing in strong support of HB 195.

Each day, I collaborate directly with patients who encounter obstacles in getting prompt healthcare—ranging from long wait times and limited providers to the difficulties associated with rural living. Patients often come to the pharmacy first because we are accessible, trusted, and embedded in their communities. However, under current law, there are limits to how much we can help, even when the need is clear and within our training.

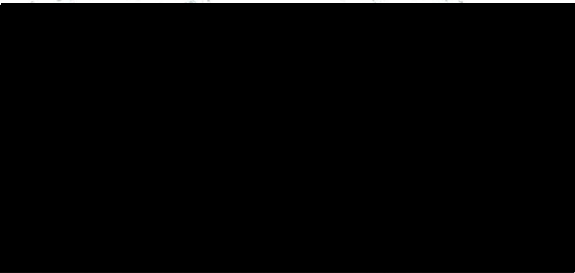

Role of the pharmacist in reducing healthcare costs: current insights

Abstract: Global healthcare expenditure is escalating at an unsustainable rate. Money spent on medicines and managing medication-related problems continues to grow. The high prevalence of medication errors and inappropriate prescribing is a major issue within healthcare systems, and can often contribute to adverse drug events, many of which are preventable. As a result, there is a huge opportunity for pharmacists to have a significant impact on reducing healthcare costs, as they have the expertise to detect, resolve, and prevent medication errors and medication-related problems. The development of clinical pharmacy practice in recent decades has resulted in an increased number of pharmacists working in clinically advanced roles worldwide. Pharmacist-provided services and clinical interventions have been shown to reduce the risk of potential adverse drug events and improve patient outcomes, and the majority of published studies show that these pharmacist activities are cost-effective or have a good cost:benefit ratio. This review demonstrates that pharmacists can contribute to substantial healthcare savings across a variety of settings. However, there is a paucity of evidence in the literature highlighting the specific aspects of pharmacists' work which are the most effective and cost-effective. Future high-quality economic evaluations with robust methodologies and study design are required to investigate what pharmacist services have significant clinical benefits to patients and substantiate the greatest cost savings for healthcare budgets.

Introduction

The role of the pharmacist has evolved substantially in recent decades. The traditional activities of the profession primarily focused on the dispensing and supply of medications, while interaction with other healthcare professionals was somewhat limited. Nowadays, pharmacists also ensure the rational and cost-effective use of medicines, promote healthy living, and improve clinical outcomes by actively engaging in direct patient care and collaborating with many healthcare disciplines. With this expanding scope of practice, pharmacists are being recognized as key components in providing individualized patient care as part of interprofessional healthcare teams.

Escalating healthcare costs

Healthcare costs are rising worldwide, due to the combination of an aging population, technological advances, the prevalence of medication errors, and increased spending on medicines year on year.¹ As the global population ages, healthcare organizations are



Dear Representative Josephson:

The Alaska State Medical Association (ASMA) represents physicians and physician assistants statewide and is primarily concerned with the health of all Alaskans.

ASMA would like to express limited support for House Bill 195. ASMA is concerned about pharmacists practicing medicine. Physicians believe there are very different roles for pharmacists in team-based clinical settings and those in retail settings.

Pharmacists practicing in clinical settings have easy access to physicians and to the patient’s medical record. These pharmacists play a critical role in managing chronic conditions and are excellent additions to the clinical team. Retail pharmacists are already overworked and over stressed. They often don’t have time to take calls from physicians; they often don’t reach out to physicians when appropriate. (A recent case reported to me involved a patient prescribed 7.5 mg of a GLP-1 medication. The pharmacy was out of stock of the 7.5 mg, the 10 mg and the 12.5 mg doses so the Carrs pharmacist dispensed 15 mg without contacting the prescribing physician.) Retail pharmacies typically do not have the space, equipment, support staff or time for necessary patient interview and examination to diagnose and treat a patient. A CLIA waived test result is just that, a piece of data, not a diagnosis. And without access to the patient’s history or medical record, the pharmacist is practicing in the dark about preexisting conditions, relevant history and other possible contraindications to standard treatment.

We urge the committee to support amending HB 195 to support collaborative practice agreements for pharmacists in clinical settings and not allow retail pharmacists to practice medicine.
