FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB0149A(MLV)

Analysis

This legislation would facilitate Alaska joining the Multistate Nurse Licensure Compact and allow registered and practical nurses licensed in any of the participating states to practice in Alaska and vice versa.

The enhanced Nurse Licensing Compact (eNLC) is an agreement between states that allow a nurse to have a license in one state, and practice in states that participate in the compact. Currently 40 states are members of the eNLC.

The nurse compacting is expected to increase nurse mobility, reduce licensure requirements and costs for nurses and employers, provide faster response to disasters, enable nurse educators and telehealth nurses to practice across multiple states, and increase public safety.

This is a zero fiscal note as the cost to both the nurse and potentially the employer is reduced because there are no additional licensing fees.
