

Governor's Budget

December 15 FY2024 Governor (in thousands):

- \$25,000.0 Fed Child Care Block Grant Discretionary Funds (FY24-FY25)
- \$1,331.9 20 Positions to Support Application Processing (FY23-FY24)
 - \$679.2 Fed
 - \$652.7 GF Match
- \$3,017.8 Maintenance of Effort (FY24-FY25)
 - \$210.4 GF Match Alaska Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
 - \$2,807.4 GF Match Tribal Assistance Programs

February 14 FY2023 Governor Amend Supplemental (in thousands):

- \$3,088.7 UGF Transfer from Medicaid Services to Public Assistance for Medicaid Eligibility Redeterminations and Application Processing
- \$3,733.0 Fed Medicaid Eligibility Redeterminations and Application Processing



Governor's Budget Cont.

February 14 FY2024 Governor Amend (in thousands):

- \$17,834.5 Medicaid Eligibility Redeterminations and Application Processing (FY24-FY25)
 - \$8,917.3 Fed
 - \$8,917.2 GF Match
- \$2,415.0 I/A Preschool Development Grant (FY24-FY26)
- \$54,234.2 Capital Allocation for Full Mainframe System Replacement
 - 56% funded through federal awards





Public Assistance Backlog Causes

1. IT systems – 40-year legacy system

- ✓ Eligibility Information System (EIS) was never fully migrated to ARIES
- ✓ Fiscal crisis delayed efforts to modernize systems



2. Pandemic – Manual Processing of benefits

- ✓ DPA was unable to automate the SNAP Emergency Allotments (EA), resulted in manually issued benefits processed by staff for over 2+ years
- ✓ The Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) benefits issued by DPA on behalf DEED
- ✓ When the state public health emergency ended and Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) clarified policy, recertifications restarted for SNAP

3. Cyber Attack in May 2021

- ✓ Pivoted existing IT staff to protection of personal health information, forensic analysis, and recovery efforts
- ✓ The majority of DPA systems were taken down requiring substantial manual processing
- ✓ Planned system changes that would have brought online forms and other improvements were further delayed

4. Open enrollment for Federally Facilitated Marketplace

✓ October 2022 – January 2023 also created a recent influx of applications

Backlog Action Steps

Included in the FY2024 Governor's Amended Budget

Short/Mid-Term Solutions

- Recruiting and onboarding additional permanent and 30 new long-term nonpermanent eligibility technician positions
- Temporary staffing contract for the Virtual Call Center
- Lengthen SNAP certification periods from 6 months to 12 months
- Security evaluations and security guards for DPA lobbies
- Securing contractors to program EIS
- Crisis Communication

Long-Term Solutions

- Online SNAP application
- Recruit and Train additional fee agents
- Migrate legacy system programs into ARIES



Child Care Funding

Preschool Development Grant

 Up to \$8M each year for 3 years, beginning 2023

Federal COVID Relief Funding

- American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Stabilization and Supplemental Direct
- Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Act
- ARPA Stabilization and CRRSA fully obligated
- ARPA Supplemental \$25M for FY24 to allow for obligation and liquidation based on federal timeline requirements
