FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. CSSB206

Analysis

The committee substitute for SB 206 moves administrative responsibility for the firearm safe storage program from the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to the Department of Administration (DOA). While the original bill established the program within DPS, including creation of a firearm safe storage grant fund and associated implementation duties, the CS moves these responsibilities to DOA.

As a result, the previously identified fiscal impacts to DPS are eliminated.
