FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA

BILL NO. SB 207

Analysis

This legislation amends the crimes of forgery in the second degree and deceptive business practices. Forgery in the second degree is amended to include rental agreements. Therefore, if, for example, a person falsely makes or possesses a forged rental agreement with the intent to defraud another person that person would be guilty of forgery in the second degree, a class C felony. A class C felony is punishable by 0-2 years in prison with a maximum possible term of 5 years. Additionally, the crime of deceptive business practices is amended to include selling, leasing or advertising for sale a dwelling that the person does not have the right to sell, lease, or advertise. Under the legislation, this conduct would be a class C felony.

While it is unknown how many additional cases the Criminal Division will see should this bill become law, the division submits a zero fiscal note at this time. The Criminal Division will continue to monitor the impacts of this bill and assess whether additional resources may be needed in the future.
