FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This bill creates a priority for personal use fishing when the Board of Fisheries places a restriction on fisheries while trying to achieve a management goal.

A comprehensive regulatory review would likely need to be undertaken by affected advisory committees and ultimately the Board of Fisheries (board) to ensure regulations are consistent with the bill language. A multiyear effort would be required for the board to review finfish and personal use finfish and shellfish fisheries over the course of a 3-year board cycle. While it is difficult to determine the increase in work load this legislation may or may not cause, using this multiyear approach is expected to reduce costs to the board. Therefore, the department submits a zero fiscal note.
