

TYPES OF MALTREATMENT VICTIMS EXPERIENCED IN 2022


- Neglect: 74%
- Mental Injury: 35%
- Physical Abuse: 24%
- Sexual Abuse: 10%





From 2009-2019, suicidal ideation in high school students increased significantly in both males and females:



How is the Alaska Children's Budget Doing?



Changes in Purchasing Power




