Statement of Changes from

HB 2222 (34-LS0864\I)

to

CSHB 222 (JUD) (34-LS0864\H)

"An Act relating to victim counseling center protective orders; relating to attorney fees; relating to the crime of violating a protective order; relating to the powers of district judges and magistrates; amending Rules 4 and 65, Alaska Rules of Civil Procedure, and Rule 9, Alaska Rules of Administration; and providing for an effective date."

New title.

Sections 1-6. No substantive changes from the previous version.

Section 7. New from previous version. Authorizes a judge to extend a stalking/sexual assault protective order issued under AS 18.65.850 for between one and five years, at the judge's discretion. Existing law only allows a judge to extend a long-term protective order for one year.

Section 8. Renumbered from previous version. No substantive changes.

Section 9. Renumbered from previous version. Narrows the scope of the bill from "workplace violence protective orders" to "victim counseling center protective orders." The other substantive provisions remain the same.

Section 10. New from previous version. Authorizes a judge to extend a domestic violence protective order issued under AS 18.66.100 for between one and five years, at the judge's discretion. Existing law only allows a judge to extend a long-term protective order for one year.

Section 11. Renumbered from previous version. No substantive changes.

Section 12. Renumbered from previous version. Conforming changes to reflect that the scope of workplace violence protective orders has been narrowed to victim counseling centers.

Sections 13-16. Renumbered from previous version. No substantive changes.
