1	E.1	Rep. Carrick	Removes the requirement of filing an annual report with the department listing the type of activity conducted and the gross receipts, the net proceeds, total value of prizes awarded as well as the source and monetary value of marketing and promotional material from distributors.
2	E.2	Rep. Carrick	Repeals section D and E from AS 05.15.165 Section D requires that operators must have/provide a certificate of insurance to conduct charitable gaming Section E requires a charitable gaming operator to have their financial records reviewed annually by a certified public accountant (CPA)
3	E.17	Rep. Carrick	Repeals section E from AS 05.15.165 Section E requires a charitable gaming operator to have their financial records reviewed annually by a certified public accountant (CPA)
4	E.3	Rep. Carrick	Removes section 40 subsection N, O, and Q from the bill
5	E.4	Rep. Carrick	Removes language stating that the payout for e-pull tabs may not exceed 90 percent
6	E.5	Rep. Carrick	Changes the requirement that a winner must sign a receipt if the prize is over \$100 back to being if the prize is over \$50
7	E.6	Rep. Carrick	Removes the record keeping requirement listed for e-pull tabs wins over \$500 or 500 times the ticket price
8	E.7	Rep. Carrick	Limits the total max number of tablets to 10 per establishment, removes the occupancy option
9	E.8	Rep. Carrick	Removes the word 'paper' to ensure that non-profits/charities are being paid upfront for the sale of all pull tabs, not just paper pull tab sales
10	E.9	Rep. Carrick	Removes the restriction that vendors can only sell paper pull tabs and e-pull tabs accessed on a tablet
11	E.10	Rep. Carrick	Repetitive to some of what is in E.3, removes language in Section 40, subsection N which would allow a distributor to submit a report to the department on behalf of a vendor.
12	E.11	Rep. Carrick	Removes section 40 subsection Q and R (partially duplicative of E.3)
13	E.13	Rep. Carrick	Removes the total ban on sale of e-pull tabs when a manufacturer owns a distributor, allows a manufacturer to have an ownership interest in not more than ONE Alaska distributor
14	E.14	Rep. Coulombe	Changes ideal payout of electronic pull tabs from 90% to 85%
15	E.16	Rep. Coulombe	Removes allowing autoclose systems when all winning tickets over a predetermined value are gone from the game/ Deletes the requirement to disclose the autoclose feature with a statement identifying when the game will close
16	E.15	Rep. Coulombe	Changes the total price a distributor can charge a permittee or licensee from 35% to 25% of the gross receipts minus the prize payouts
