FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act relating to education funding; providing for an effective date by amending the
2 effective date of secs. 10, 11, 13, and 15, ch. 5, SLA 2025; and providing for an effective
3 date."

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

5 * **Section 1.** AS 14.03.410(e) is amended to read:

6 (e) A student in an early education program may not be counted in a district's
7 ADM under AS 14.17.600 [AS 14.17.500] unless the department has approved the
8 program.

4 before the consolidation as the base fiscal year to offset that decrease for the
5 first four fiscal years following consolidation according to the following
6 method:

17 multiplying that number by the sum of the district's ADM of the
18 consolidated schools for the current fiscal year without adjustment, and
19 adding that number to the sum of the district's ADM of the consolidated
20 schools for the current fiscal year as adjusted under (A) - (C) of this
21 paragraph;

22 (ii) for the third fiscal year after the base fiscal year, the
23 district's ADM of the consolidated schools as adjusted under (A) - (C)
24 of this paragraph is calculated by dividing the sum of the district's
25 ADM of the consolidated schools as adjusted under (A) - (C) of this
26 paragraph for the base fiscal year by the sum of the district's ADM of
27 the consolidated schools for the base fiscal year without adjustment,
28 and subtracting the quotient obtained by dividing the sum of the
29 district's ADM of the consolidated schools for the current fiscal year as
30 adjusted under (A) - (C) of this paragraph by the sum of the district's
31 ADM of the consolidated schools for the current fiscal year,

1 multiplying that number by the sum of the district's ADM of the
 2 consolidated schools for the current fiscal year without adjustment,
 3 multiplying that number by 66 percent, and adding that number to the
 4 sum of the district's ADM of the consolidated schools for the current
 5 fiscal year as adjusted under (A) - (C) of this paragraph;

6 (iii) for the fourth fiscal year after the base fiscal year,
 7 the district's ADM of the consolidated schools as adjusted under (A) -
 8 (C) of this paragraph is calculated by dividing the sum of the district's
 9 ADM of the consolidated schools as adjusted under (A) - (C) of this
 10 paragraph for the base fiscal year by the sum of the district's ADM of
 11 the consolidated schools for the base fiscal year without adjustment,
 12 and subtracting the quotient obtained by dividing the sum of the
 13 district's ADM of the consolidated schools for the current fiscal year as
 14 adjusted under (A) - (C) of this paragraph by the sum of the district's
 15 ADM of the consolidated schools for the current fiscal year,
 16 multiplying that number by the sum of the district's ADM of the

15 that was consolidated in the district more than once every seven years for

18 paragraph shall provide the department with the list of schools participating in
19 the consolidation and the corresponding ADM;

22 the district as of January 1 of the second preceding fiscal year, as determined by the
23 Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development under AS 14.17.510 and

29 * **Sec. 7.** AS 14.17.420(a) is amended to read:

30 (a) As a component of public school funding, a district is eligible for special
31 needs and secondary school vocational and technical instruction funding and may be

1 eligible for intensive services funding as follows:

2 (1) special needs funding is available to a district to assist the district
3 in providing special education, gifted and talented education, vocational education,
4 and bilingual education services to its students; a special needs funding factor of 1.20
5 shall be applied as set out in AS 14.17.410(b)(1);

6 (2) in addition to the special needs funding for which a district is
7 eligible under (1) of this subsection, a district is eligible for intensive services funding
8 [FOR EACH SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENT WHO NEEDS AND RECEIVES
9 INTENSIVE SERVICES AND IS ENROLLED ON THE LAST DAY OF THE
10 COUNT PERIOD; FOR EACH SUCH STUDENT, INTENSIVE SERVICES
11 FUNDING IS] equal to the intensive student count multiplied by 13; **the intensive
12 student count equals the greater of the following:**

13 **(A) the number of special education students who needed
14 and received intensive services and were enrolled on the last day of the
15 count period conducted in the previous fiscal year under AS 14.17.600(a);**

16 **(B) the number of special education students who needed
17 and received intensive services and were enrolled on the last day of the
18 count period conducted in the current fiscal year under AS 14.17.600(a);**

19 **(C) the number of special education students who needed
20 and received intensive services and were enrolled on February 15 of the
21 current fiscal year, if a district chooses to conduct a second student count
22 for the current fiscal year under this subparagraph;**

23 (3) in addition to the special needs and intensive services funding
24 available under (1) and (2) of this subsection, secondary school vocational and
25 technical instruction funding is available to assist districts in providing vocational and
26 technical instruction to students who are enrolled in a secondary school; a secondary
27 school vocational and technical instruction funding factor of 1.015 shall be applied as
28 set out in AS 14.17.410(b)(1); in this paragraph, "vocational and technical instruction"
29 excludes costs associated with

30 (A) administrative expenses; and

31 (B) instruction in general literacy, mathematics, and job

2 * **Sec. 8.** AS 14.17.600(a) is amended to read:

3 (a) Within two weeks after the end of the 20-school-day period ending the
4 fourth Friday in October, each district shall transmit a report to the department that,
5 under regulations adopted by the department, reports the district's [ITS] ADM for
6 that count period, the prior three-year average ADM for each school in the
7 district, student count information the department determines is necessary to
8 calculate school ADMs under AS 14.17.450 and community and charter school
9 ADMs that relate to the district under AS 14.17.905, and other student count
10 information that [WILL AID] the department shall use to determine the amount of
11 the district's [IN MAKING A DETERMINATION OF ITS] state aid under the public
12 school funding program for the succeeding fiscal year. The district shall also
13 include in the district's report the number of special education students who
14 needed and received intensive services and are enrolled on the last day of the
15 count period, which the department shall use to determine the amount of the
16 district's intensive services funding under AS 14.17.420(a)(2)(A) for the
17 succeeding fiscal year and, if applicable, additional intensive services funding
18 under AS 14.17.420(a)(2)(B) for the current fiscal year. For centralized
19 correspondence study, the October report shall be based on the period from July 1
20 through the fourth Friday in October. The department may make necessary corrections
21 in the report submitted and shall notify the district of changes made. The
22 commissioner shall notify the governor of additional appropriations the commissioner
23 estimates to be necessary to fully finance the public school funding program for the
24 succeeding [CURRENT] fiscal year.

25 * **Sec. 9.** AS 14.17.600 is amended by adding new subsections to read:

26 (c) Part-time students shall be included in the student count data in accordance
27 with regulations adopted by the department.

28 (d) When reporting a district's ADM, a part-time student who is a
29 correspondence student may not be counted as more than one full-time equivalent
30 student.

31 (e) Except as provided in (f) - (h) of this section, a student in a district-wide

1 early education program provided by a district and approved by the department under
2 AS 14.07.020(a)(8) is counted as one-half of a full-time equivalent student.

3 (f) A district may not include in a school's ADM students who are four and
4 five years of age if the students are enrolled in an early education program that
5 receives state or federal funding other than funding under this chapter.

6 (g) A district may not include in a school's ADM students who are four and
7 five years of age if inclusion of the students would result in an increase of total state
8 aid attributable to district-wide early education programs approved under
9 AS 14.03.410 of more than \$3,000,000 from the previous fiscal year. The department
10 shall prioritize the funding of district-wide early education programs, giving priority to
11 districts with lower performance, based on the department's ranking of districts under
12 AS 14.03.410(c). When the number of students in a district-wide early education
