FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This bill creates a new type of protective order to address workplace violence. Under the provisions of the bill an employer may petition for a workplace violence protective order if the employer reasonably believes the person committed an act of violence against the employer or employee that occurred at the employer’s workplace or made a threat of violence against the employer or an employee that could be construed to be carried out at the workplace.

If this bill were to pass it is likely that the Criminal Division would see additional case referrals. However, the division is unable to predict with any certainty how many additional cases would be referred or the amount of litigation that would be associated with those cases. Therefore, the division submits a zero fiscal note at this time and will continue to assess the impacts of this legislation and whether additional resources may be needed.
