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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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SB 9 amends Children in Need of Aid (CINA) statute 47.10.013(c) (Abandonment – Safe Surrender) by adding a method which an infant may be safely surrendered. The amendment adds, outside of a physical person, an infant safety device as a method for surrendering an infant. The amendment includes requirements of an infant safety device, defines the department's authority to implement and train those who employ the use of a box, and defines a designated facility.				
However the funding source for the safe surrender devices is unclear as described in this amendment.				

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
