**Analysis**

The bill creates section 14.17.495 which requires the Department to provide free breakfast and lunch in public schools subject to appropriation. This establishes “universal free” meals in all public schools that choose to participate in Alaska and serves all children, regardless of income or demonstrable need.

The bill requires the Department to maximize its receipt of federal assistance, primarily through the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP). The state would need to provide \$28,578.0 in additional general funds to public school districts based upon School Year 2022-2023 financial data of food service program deficits. This does not reflect increased need for any additional meals served for students not currently participating in the programs.

The bill adds an Education Associate I for claiming and expected additional sponsor training and support for new schools/sponsors and increased activity at existing schools.

The fiscal impact in the first year of implementation is \$28,725.4. This includes an Education Associate I (\$95.2 Range 13), chargeback (\$17.6), grantee monitoring contract (\$19.6), travel support to support districts and provide training (\$4.0), one-time expense for the development of regulations (\$6.0), and one-time expense for materials and supplies (\$5.0)

The fiscal impact of subsequent years is \$28,714.4.
