Analysis

This bill Creates a new Class A felony for organized theft for those who participate in a coordinated effort to commit theft in the first degree (class B felony) and theft in the second degree (class C felony) with groups of three or more persons, repeatedly. Additionally, this bill expands theft in the second degree to include theft of medical records and information and expands theft in the third degree to include theft of mail.
