



Existing Infrastructure


- Robust infrastructure exists for delivering goods to & from communities

- AVCP/Donlin Gold/Delta Backhaul (Y-K Delta)


- Cook Inlet Keeper (Kenai Peninsula Borough)

- Established recyclers who accept ewaste in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Kodiak






Not Starting from Scratch

- A lot of progress has been made over 20+ years
- Many organizations are involved in ewaste recycling
- SB61 borne out of a multiyear stakeholder process
- Many experienced communities and organization available to help



Need for Stable, Long-term Funding

- Limited Community Funds for Backhaul & Recycling
- Organizations like Backhaul AK rely on Federal Grants
- Uncertainty is a barrier long term investment and planning
- SB61 would establish stable long-term funding




Big Picture
