# STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

#### BILL NO. HB 74

#### Analysis

This legislation makes it a class A misdemeanor to knowingly sell, offer for sale, install, or reinstall a replacement airbag that does not comply with federal safety regulations, an airbag that is counterfeit or nonfunctioning, or anything that is designed to conceal that an airbag is counterfeit or nonfunctioning. Under the legislation it is also a class A misdemeanor to knowingly manufacture a counterfeit or nonfunctioning airbag or a device intended to conceal that an airbag is counterfeit or nonfunctioning airbag or a device intended to conceal that an airbag is counterfeit or nonfunctioning airbag or a device intended to conceal that an airbag is counterfeit or nonfunctioning or to sell a vehicle that has a replacement airbag that does not comply with federal regulations or that is counterfeit or nonfunctioning.

The legislation makes it a class C felony if death or serious physical injury results from the sale or manufacture of an airbag or a vehicle with an airbag that does not meet federal regulations or that is counterfeit or nonfunctioning.

It is unclear how many additional cases will be generated should this legislation become law. However, the Criminal Division does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this legislation.
