## Analysis

This bill increases the penalties for those accused of various theft crimes by lowering the property value thresholds that define theft crimes and their severity. This bill also creates a new crime of organized theft, in which a person, as part of a coordinated plan, commits two or more thefts at a commercial establishment within a year with one or more accomplices.
New crimes and increased penalties as a result of increasing charging levels for crimes generally result in additional workload for the Office of Public Advocacy. Although the Agency is unable to absorb significant workload increases, the Agency does not anticipate a significant increase in appointments based on this legislation and submits a zero fiscal note accordingly.
