## STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

## **Analysis**

The language of HB 26 directs the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) to (1) specifically consider transit when conducting multimodal and intermodal plans and studies, (2) to study modal alternatives in rural and remote areas, and (3) create a statewide transit plan.	
In practice, this bill would result in no change to operations, funding, or designation of resources. All elements of this bill are currently being accommodated and pursued as part of the current, ongoing planning process to expand the department's "family of plans" already in progress and driven largely by standing federal requirements.	
Given the language largely is already supported by existing DOT&PF efforts, including community transit programs, by existing statutory authority and agency activities, the department does not anticipate a fiscal impact and therefore submits a zero fiscal note.
