SUBJECT: Responses to Committee Questions from ARRC Overview Presentation

Sen. Stedman asked that the Alaska Railroad provide an overview of the work left to do on each segment of the Port McKenzie Rail Extension.

The 32-mile rail extension project from Houston to Port MacKenzie has been divided into six segments for construction purposes. With prior state funding awarded to the Mat-Su Borough, much of the embankment construction has been completed in the majority of these segments, although significant work remains. A 2023 estimate prepared by HDR determined an additional \$250-\$300 million in funding is needed to complete design and construction of the project.

Remaining work by segment:

Segment 1: Grade repairs, subballast, track work, communication lines, communication tower

Segment 2: Civil work (embankment and bridge construction), subballast, track work, communication lines, operational support facilities, utilities

Segment 3: Grade repairs, subballast, track work, communication lines, grade crossing approaches

Segment 4: Grade repairs, subballast, track work, communication lines, grade crossing approaches

Segment 5: Approach signal, grade repairs, subballast, track work, communication lines, grade crossing approaches

Segment 6: Complete
