Thank you for the opportunity to provide more information about the Snowmobile Trail Development Program and Grants the knowledge we have about the Snow Machine Registration Receipts.

Responses to questions:

1. Approximately 1,100 miles of snow trail are currently being groomed.
2. Snow Machine Registration Receipts are authorized in AS 28.39.010-250. The fund source code is 1195 Snow Machine Registration Receipts (DGF) with no restrictions or statutory designations.

Division of Parks requests a capital project each year to receive Snow Machine Registration Receipts authority. Below is a list of a few prior authorized Snowmobile capital projects.
