FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This legislation amends AS 33.30.011(a)(11) requiring the Department of Corrections (DOC) to make a good faith effort to ensure releasing prisoners have a valid state identification card (ID) upon release and adds a new section AS 33.30.105 establishing authority for DOC to provide releasing offenders an ID card upon release, valid for 180 days, when the offender does not have a valid ID.

Currently, prisoners that do not have a valid ID or driver's license are issued a document or DOC issued picture ID that is taken to the Department of Motor Vehicles and allows the person to obtain a valid ID or DL which is then paid by the DOC.

Recognizing the DOC issued ID as a valid ID will better assist releasing offenders with obtaining necessary and needed reentry services and assist in successful community reentry.

This legislation will have no impact to the current process in place within the DOC, therefore, no financial impact is anticipated with this legislation.
