


About PNWER



The U.S. - Canada Partnership


A Bi-National Economic Platform

PNWER Canada Priority Projects

PNWER Canada has identified three proposed projects to direct its focus towards over the next several years:

1. **Pacific Northwest Hydrogen Hub Plan:** Connecting the PNW Hydrogen Hub Initiative to innovations in H2 technology in B.C. and Alberta.
2. **PNWER Regional Tourism Council Plan:** Engaging public and private stakeholders to develop a plan to prepare for an increase in Tourism to our region surrounding FIFA and beyond.
3. **Electrification Workforce Development Plan:** Help cultivate a skilled workforce capable of meeting the needs of the electrified economy.



PNWER addresses a breadth of regional issues through working groups. Each working group is coordinated by a PNWER staff member and headed by two co-chairs, one from the private sector and one from the public sector.



Regional Infrastructure Accelerator

www.RIANorthwest.org



PNWER's Regional Infrastructure Accelerator is a USDOT-funded program that connects multi-state transportation projects with innovative federal financing mechanisms, including TIFIA and RRIF loan programs and Public-Private Partnerships (P3s).



Build Northwest Center of Excellence

Serves as the overarching platform for all outreach activities, offering education on innovative federal financing tools.

- Hosted TIFIA/RRIF action plan workshop at Alaska Municipal League (AML) Annual Conference



High Performance Rail

Improve performance and safety of existing passenger and freight rail systems by identifying and bundling rail projects.

- Assisted City of Spokane Valley, WA in securing a \$21 million RAISE grant for the Pines Road grade separation



Zero-Emission Commercial Refueling

Supporting development of zero-emission refueling infrastructure for medium- and heavy-duty vehicles along freight corridors.

- Drayage decarbonization at Ports of Seattle and Tacoma
- Designing a zero-emission vehicle incentive program on behalf of the WA Joint Transportation Committee



Critical Connections

Improve connectivity of Tribal nations and rural communities by updating, replacing or improving connective infrastructure.

- Working with AML to assist AK coastal communities with bundling projects, and identifying project funding and financing sources

PNWER Regional Tourism Council

- Proposed during PNWER Annual Summit in Boise, ID in July 2023
- Approved by PNWER Executive Board in September 2023
- In-person Roundtable held at Port of Seattle with 30 public and industry leaders in October 2023
- Initial Focus: Readiness for the 2026 FIFA World Cup - Cross-border collaboration on security, trade, and travel

PNWER Regional Tourism Council

Governance Structure

- Two representatives from each PNWER jurisdiction:
 - Elected Official
 - Industry Sector Member
- Serve for a term of two years
- Led by Public Official Chair and Industry Sector Chair elected from the Council members
- Supported by strategic sub-committee - Business Council

Next Steps

- Seeking two AK representatives
 - Elected Official
 - Industry Sector Leader
- First Governance Meeting scheduled for mid-late March



Legislative Energy Horizon Institute (LEHI)

- A 60-hour certificate course over 2 sessions, LEHI helps policymakers understand how energy systems and infrastructure work; how energy infrastructure is built and financed; and the regulation and market impacts on energy infrastructure
- Institute Partners include PNWER, National Conference of State Legislatures, University of Idaho, National Governors Association, Dept. of Energy, Gov. of Canada, Pacific Northwest National Laboratory, Women in Government
- 400+ alumni since 2009. Legislators, governors advisors, and local policymakers from 45 US states and 5 Canadian provinces and territories, incl. 30 alumni from AK
- **2024 Dates: July 12 - 16, in Richland, WA and November 20 - 23, in Washington, D.C.**
