# STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

#### BILL NO. HB047

#### Analysis

HB 47 establishes the new crimes of distribution of generated child sexual abuse material and possession of generated child sexual abuse material. A person is guilty of distribution of child sexual abuse material, generally, if they distribute material that depicts a child under the age of 18 engaging in sexual or lewd conduct, and that material is also obscene. Distribution of generated child sexual abuse material is a class B sex felony or a class A sex felony if the person has been previously convicted. A person is guilty of possession of generated child sexual abuse material if they possess or accesses a computer with the intent to view the material described above. Possession of generated child sexual abuse material is a class C sex felony.

It is unknown how many additional cases will be referred to the Criminal Division if this bill were to become law. The division submits a zero fiscal note at this time and will continue to monitor the impacts of this bill to determine whether additional resources may be needed in the future.
