BILL NO. SB 54

Analysis

Senate Bill 54 extends existing law authorizing the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission to maintain a vessel-based limited entry system for the weathervane scallop and Bering Sea hair crab fisheries. Passage of this legislation will have no fiscal impact on the Division of Commercial Fisheries.
