Dear Senate Resource Committee,

I write to you on behalf of myself as the executive director of Island Trails Network, a Kodiak based nonprofit focused on trails and waterways, our volunteer board (6), our member-donors (130), and all our outdoor recreation supporters (850).

We are concerned and disagree with Governor Dunleavy's recent Executive Orders, specifically EO 126, the elimination of the Wood-Tikchik State Park Management Council, and EO 134, the elimination of the Recreation Rivers Advisory Board. **Please call a joint session and vote to stop these Executive Orders from becoming law.**

We believe public lands and waterways require **the most public involvement** to ensure they are managed for the people. If these Executive Orders become law, the public's voice and local knowledge will be significantly diminished.

The Island Trails Network Community that I represent does not support having public lands and resources managed solely for "efficient administration." We believe the management should be thoughtful, with significant value placed on local knowledge and public input.

Dear Alaska State Senate and Legislature,

I am a 34 year resident of Dillingham, life-long resident of Alaska, graduate of UAF.

I currently serve on the Nushagak ADFG Advisory Committee as secretary, and I'm Vice Chair of the Bristol Bay Federal Subsistence Advisory Council. I retired from ADFG as the Bristol Bay Area Sport Fisheries Biologist. While I was employed I took a turn as the ADFG member of the Wood Tikchik Council. I am a user of the Park for recreational fishing and hunting.

In my time living adjacent to the Park, I have not been aware that the council presented any particular obstacles or inefficiencies in the operation of the Park. It baffles me why this has been made an issue by the current administration.

I oppose EO 126. I think it is a terrible mistake to disenfranchise the local users and communities from park management.

The extremely sparse staffing of this park makes local buy-in and support mandatory.

Removing or downgrading the Council could jeopardize local support and make it much more difficult to have a well functioning park and may lead to more violations and possibly damage.

It is my impression that this Park would not have been successfully formed if there had been no provision for local public input and management.

In my experience Alaska Dept Natural Resources can seem quite indifferent to local concerns and input UNLESS there is direct local empowerment such as the Wood-Tikchik Park Management Council provides.

Given the numerous private Native Land Claims and other in-holdings within the Park, the Council provides an essential avenue for local influence. I believe the Council has been instrumental in facilitating some in-holding exchanges and land trades that were beneficial to all future users of the park AND the original land holders.

Example 1 is the land exchange that made it possible to have the wonderful public boat launch and parking facility at Aleknagik. This was a very complex exchange that has been a great success. Second was the land exchange that resulted in keeping the Agulowak River corridor undeveloped and maintaining the natural wild nature and public access to a world class sport fishing river AND critical salmon spawning area - all while providing compensation to the original land holders. One of the very first exchanges was made at the head of the Agulupak River whereby the Allotment holder was compensated and the natural lands and public access preserved in perpetuity. These were all win - win arrangements that I believe worked due to the strong local participation of the communities and Council. I am probably overlooking other such healthy arrangements made possible with the strong local control of the Council.

I am concerned that Park management could become too easily manipulated by political whim from the population centers of Alaska with little regard to local needs.

As evidence of misguided politics, note the Allen River hydro power funding from the Legislature in 2013 & 14 that utterly disregarded the WT Park management program as well as

disregarding the FACTS that studies in the 1980s had proven such a project to be non-viable from a scientific standpoint; there was NO NEW technology in 2014 to address the problems identified in the 1980s studies. What a terrible waste of 10 million state dollars!

Please put a stop to EO 126. It is not needed or wanted.

If there are changes the Administration needs then let them present to them in the proper fashion to the Legislature and Park Council with clear justification and public discussion.

RE: EO 126 Eliminate Wood-Tikchik State Park Management Council

Honorable Senators:

I am opposed to the governor's executive order to eliminate the Wood-Tikchik State Park Management Council. I understand the governor's reason is in "the best interests of efficient administration," and that public input would be received through a citizen advisory boards as in most of the other Alaska state parks.

This abrupt and controversial action did not follow the usual public process with involvement of the legislature. The WTSPMC is a functional Council with essential local and tribal representation of a large, remote, and extraordinary state park. Executive Order 126 is unnecessary and inappropriate.

Wood-Tikchik is the largest state park in the COUNTRY at 1.6 million acres. Unlike other informal state park citizen advisory boards, local representation with guidance by the Commissioners from the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Fish and Game is guaranteed by Alaska statutes. Five seats specifically focus on local knowledge and tribal representation with three seats are assigned to area villages: Koliganek, New Stuyahok, and Algnagik, one seat for a member of the city council of Dillingham, and one seat for the Bristol Bay Native Association. The Commissioner of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of the Department of Fish and Game serve on the other two seats.

I believe that a typical informal citizen advisory board would not serve the best interests of this state park or the public. No allocation of village representation is guaranteed, or the participation from DNR or ADFG in this forum. I have concerns about this magnificent state park becoming more susceptible to resource development, particularly mining extraction if this important mechanism for local and tribal involvement is dissolved and management is primarily left in control of the governor.

The Wood-Tikchik State Park Management Council has performed well since its inception in 1978 and remains active and involved. I urge the legislature to override this executive order and leave well enough alone.

Oppose Executive Orders 126 and 134

I oppose Executive Orders 126 and 134. In general, I oppose the elimination of any state government advisory boards unless there is an excellent and detailed explanation for why they should be eliminated. To simply state that eliminating these boards would "make state government as efficient and effective as possible" is unacceptable.

Advisory boards are an important conduit between agencies and the public. They provide advice developed from years of practical experience. Most advisory board members care deeply about the resources the boards give advice about.

While the boards do take up a small amount of staff time, they give back so much more in knowledge, expertise, and historical perspective. The benefits far outweigh the costs.

One example: the late Sen. Mike Kelly used advice from the advisory board for the northern region of Alaska State Parks to create a win-win situation regarding motorized use of trails in the Chena River State Recreation Area. A strong proponent of motorized use, Sen. Kelly learned from advisory board members how summer ATV use was damaging lowland trails. Using that advice, Sen. Kelly worked for funding for upland sustainable trails in the Chena River State Recreation Area (Compeau Trail, Angel Creek Hillside Trail).

These trails are now used in winter and summer by motorized and non-motorized users. The trails have much less erosion and therefore are much more sustainable in the long run. Not only does this cut down on maintenance costs, it helps make the trails more enjoyable for everyone.

Advisory boards bring a great benefit with low cost to the state. Please oppose their elimination without demonstrable proof that they are not worth the minimal cost.
