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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 121

Analysis

SB 121 provides that out-of-network claims be reimbursed at the 75th percentile except for primary care, which is to be reimbursed at 450% of Medicare. It also provides that all health care providers who bill under the same Current Procedure Technology (CPT) code be reimbursed at the same rate.

The bill requires that the division periodically audit and validate the methodology used by a health care insurer to ensure that the allowable charges are in accordance with Title 21.

The bill requires that a health care insurer, reimbursement provider, regardless of specialty or discipline, bill at the same rate provided that they bill at the same CPT. The division anticipates this will lead to a significant increase in consumer complaints, from providers, to ensure that the reimbursement is correct.

If this legislation passes, the Division of Insurance will require one full-time position to oversee implementation of this legislation, as well as associated costs. A breakout of the fiscal impact of this legislation is outlined below.
