Re: EO124: CLEAN LIST TRANSFER

Dear Senators Bishop and Giessel,

Thank you for the opportunity for the Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) to provide supplemental information on Executive Order 124 following the hearing of the Senate Resources Committee on February 5, 2024. Please find the requests and corresponding responses below.

1. What kind of studies does ADF&G conduct to review a request to add or remove a species?

Division of Wildlife Conservation (DWC) staff conduct a literary review to ensure there is no evidence the requested species does not meet the criteria under 5 AAC 92.029(h) and present the information to the Board of Game (BOG) for a decision on whether to place the species on the clean list. The role of DWC staff will not change. Staff will continue to conduct a robust scientific review to protect Alaska's valuable wildlife populations; however, the commissioner will now make the determination to add or remove a species from the clean list based on the information presented by staff. As currently specified in regulation, there must be clear and convincing evidence that the requested species:

- Is not capable of surviving in the wild in Alaska
- Is not capable of causing a genetic alteration of a species that is indigenous to Alaska
- Is not capable of causing a significant reduction in the population of a species that is indigenous to Alaska
- Is not capable of transmitting a disease to a species that is indigenous to Alaska
- Does not otherwise present a threat to the health or population of a species that is indigenous to Alaska

- Is not captured from the wild for use as a pet
- Does not present a conservation concern in the species' native habitat outside of this state
- Can be reasonably maintained in good health in private ownership
- Does not present a likelihood that concerns about, or threats to human health and safety will lead to adverse consequences to captive animals

2. Provide a list of species on the clean list under 5 AAC 92.029.

Attachment 1 includes a table of all species currently on the clean list.

3. Would this allow finfish farming or the introduction of northern pike into other areas in Alaska now or in the future?

No. First, this transfer of authority is limited to the BOG's authority over pets and livestock, including mammals, birds, and reptiles. The Board of Fisheries (BOF) maintains authority over "ornamental fish" under 5 AAC 41.070, such as goldfish, betas, and guppies as well as aquatic invertebrates, and amphibians that are common in the aquaria trade. Additionally, the BOF maintains authority over the banned aquatic invasive species list under 5 AAC 41.075.

Second, AS 16.40.210 was passed in 1990 by the Legislature and prohibits the growing or cultivation of any finfish in Alaska. Unless this statute is amended or repealed, finfish farming is expressly prohibited in Alaska.
