Re: Executive Order No. 132

Dear Senator Kiehl,

On behalf of Sealaska Corporation, I write in opposition to the adoption of Executive Order No. 132 that would eliminate the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council.

The interests of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve are best served when citizens have direct participation in the development and monitoring of the management plan for the Preserve.

The lands encompassed in the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve are the ancient homelands of the Tlingits of Haines and Klukwan. They are also their current homelands.

As you might be aware Haines did not receive land under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971 (ANCSA) and Klukwan ANCSA lands are located some three miles away from the Village. Thus, the lands in the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve have become even more significant to the Chilkat/Chilkoot Tlingit.

We strongly believe that the Department of Fish and Game should continue to consult with the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council before the adoption of regulations governing fish and game management in the Preserve by the Board of Fisheries or the Board of Game. I am sure that you are aware that subsistence hunting and fishing and traditional uses of the Preserve remain critical for Alaska Native food security and our cultural survival.

The Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council has worked diligently to protect the Chilkat Bald Eagle from adverse environmental impacts. It is critical that they continue to participate in the development and monitoring of the management plan for the Preserve.

The bald eagle might have some national significance, but that pales in comparison to the significance of the bald eagle in Tlingit history and culture. If there is going to

be any integrity in the concept of local control in Alaska, the voice of the original locals will endure.

I understand that the Senate Resources Committee is holding a hearing on Executive Order No. 132, and I respectfully request that my comments be added into the Hearing record. I further urge that you in representing both Haines and Klukwan oppose its adoption.

To Senators Kiehl, Bishop, Giessel, Wielechowski, Kawasaki, Kaufman, Dunbar, and Claman,

Chilkat Indian Village (Klukwan) is a Federally- Recognized Tribal government with inherent sovereignty and our Tribal constitution requires us to protect our Tribal lands and the interests of our Tribal members.<sup>1</sup>

Chilkat Indian Village (Klukwan) engages in Government-to-Government consultation with the U.S. federal government, State of Alaska and local governments on projects and actions that impact our traditional lands and waters. Our traditional lands extends over 2.6 million acres from Stonehouse, north of the Canadian border, to Berner's Bay, north of Juneau. The mountains are our fenceposts. This valley has supported our way of life since time immemorial, and we want to ensure we can continue our traditional ways of life into the future to the Seventh Generation.

**We are asking the Alaska State Legislature to reject Executive Order 132 by passing a Special Concurrent Resolution protecting the integrity of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council.** The State of Alaska has been committed to the health and welfare of Chilkat Bald Eagles since 1972, when the Alaska State legislature first created a "critical habitat area" for Chilkat Bald Eagles encompassing pieces of our traditional lands where eagles congregate during fall migration to feed on our late fall wild salmon runs. The state of Alaska legislature identified places for future study and protection, and these lands, through a four-year cooperative research effort, became the designated boundaries of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve in June 1982. Chilkat Indian Village has held a seat on the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council since its inception in 1982. The Advisory Council ensures that cooperative governance over these state lands and waters protects local involvement in all decisions.

**Executive Order 132** would remove our seat at the table on the Advisory Council. It will remove our Tribal voices from any management decisions made in the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve.<sup>2</sup> Without the Advisory Council, no governing body with Alaska Native voices is available to decide on issues that will impact our traditional ways of life.

**Executive Order 132** would remove our ability to participate in stewardship of the Chilkat Valley lands and waters. It will remove our ability to share our traditional knowledge and history of the area to guide management of the Bald Eagle Preserve. The original preserve designation was based on cooperative research studies that our Tribal Government reviewed during the plan's creation. The Advisory Council in consultation with federal, state, Tribal governments and agencies, decides when and in what ways to conduct new management planning processes. By removing this advisory council, the governor is giving all control to the Alaska Department of Natural Resources, removing any local control or Tribal government representation in decision-making.

If enacted, Executive Order 132 may lead to federal government action to protect lands and waters in the valley. The original proposal to protect lands and waters for salmon and Bald Eagles in the Chilkat Valley would have created a National Wildlife Refuge. Our Tribal Government was opposed to the original plan for the bald eagle preserve because we were concerned about the loss of our traditional lands and waters, including specific Native Allotments. We lobbied against the designation of the preserve. Because all parties involved proceeded with a state preserve guided by an Advisory Council where we have a seat at the table, we support the current preserve through the Advisory Council. The state of Alaska cannot simultaneously say that it supports "local control" when it comes to the federal government's actions, and then take away local control from its own residents. Governor Dunleavy is proposing an action that would remove all local control over the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve, and so it will be possible that federal action will be necessary to ensure the protection of fish and wildlife in the Chilkat Valley. Bald Eagles are federally protected under the Bald Eagle Protection Act. Recent research in the Chilkat Valley estimates that at least 2% of the Bald Eagle population for North America relies on the Chilkat Valley during fall migration – an important time for Bald Eagles to find food sources. The Chilkat Valley has both fall salmon runs, and large congregations of water birds, the two main food sources for Bald Eagles during the autumn season. It is possible that this Executive Order will lead to an outcome where the federal government requires oversight of state of Alaska activities and local voices will be lost. We have supported the Bald Eagle Preserve specifically because we have a seat on the Advisory Council.

Protecting the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council saves the state of Alaska money and time in dealing with conflicts. Without local control and Tribal government involvement in decision-making for this area, it is possible the state of Alaska will have to deal with more legal challenges and costly conflicts in user groups. The formation of the advisory council solved many issues and has at times been very active and instrumental in shaping management decisions. For example, when commercial guides were actively baiting eagles for their tour operations, the Advisory Council worked hard to stop this activity before the federal government had to be involved due to federal regulations. The advisory council gives local

voices a chance to share local knowledge to solve problems. It is a model of cooperative governance that should be modeled across the state, not dismissed by Executive Order.

**Please work together to deny Executive Order 132.** The Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council was established under state law through multi-year compromise led by the Alaska State Legislature, state and federal governments, local community leaders, and Tribal Government and Native Corporation engagement. Each of these government and citizen entities now have seats at a table that determines actions and issues on these state lands and waters. Executive Order 132 would dissolve this diverse coalition of local knowledge and voices and consolidate power in one agency in the State of Alaska with no local presence in the Chilkat Valley. Our Tribal Government has challenged several decisions made by the Department of Natural Resources in the Chilkat Valley, most of which have been met with no response from the agency. We cannot trust that they will act in partnership with us if given authority over the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve.

Our Tribal Constitution requires us to protect the lands and waters of our Grandfathers for future generations by ensuring that our voices are represented on the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council. We ask that you support our voices being heard on our Grandfathers' and Grandchildren's lands, through the Alaska Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council as it was intended to when created. **We are asking the Alaska State Legislature to reject Executive Order 132 by passing a Special Concurrent Resolution protecting the integrity of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council.**

**Re: Executive Order No. 132**

Dear Co-Chairs Giessel and Bishop and members of the Senate Resources Committee,

On behalf of the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Tlingit & Haida), I write in opposition to Executive Order No. 132 to eliminate the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council (Advisory Council).

The Central Council of the Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Tlingit & Haida) is the largest federally recognized tribe in Alaska, representing 37,000 tribal citizens in communities stretching over 43,000 square miles (about half the area of Colorado) across the Southeast Alaska Panhandle and beyond. Our traditional homelands encompass a 525-mile strip of rugged coastline and interior waterways.

Tlingit peoples have stewarded their traditional homelands of Jilkáat Kwáan (and the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve) since time immemorial; Southeast Alaska has benefited from this stewardship, both economically and environmentally, since the creation of the critical habitat area for Chilkat Bald Eagles within the Preserve in 1982. The Advisory Council has provided a collaborative and functioning process for the local governance of this area, including a way for tribes to share knowledge and history of this place with everyone who is responsible for its future.

Perhaps you heard some of my comments in the Capitol earlier this week related to the importance of ensuring adequate representation of Alaska Native peoples in as many seats on boards and commissions as possible. The Advisory Council is an effective way to ensure Tribal voices – the voices of our sovereign governments, are included in the decisions that impact our traditional lands and waters. The governor's Executive Order will consolidate power under one agency in the State of Alaska and could relinquish the ability for Tribal governments to have a meaningful role in the process.

**On behalf of Tlingit & Haida, I ask the Alaska State Legislature to reject Executive Order 132 by passing a Special Concurrent Resolution that will protect the integrity of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council – now and into the future.**

Executive Order 132 – Aaron Brakel, Southeast Alaska Conservation Council

Good afternoon to the Co-Chairs and members of the Committee.

My name is Aaron Brakel and I am the Clean Water Campaign Manager for the Southeast Alaska Conservation Council. I live here in Juneau, where I had the good fortune to grow up on Áakw K̓wáan land.

The Southeast Alaska Conservation Council is a homegrown regional grassroots organization based here in Juneau. We have worked for over 50 years to protect the fundamental elements that our regional economy and livelihoods are based on, clean water, healthy habitat, and productive and intact forests and waterways. We have many members in Haines, Klukwan, and the Chilkat Valley as well as across Alaska, and have worked for decades to ensure the long-term health of the Chilkat Watershed.

We acknowledge, honor, and support the strong stewardship of the Chilkat Indian Village, of the Tlingit people of Jilkáat K̓wáan, of the ancient village of Klukwan, and we uphold their name for the lands and waters of the Chilkat Watershed, Jilkáat Aani K̓a Héeni.

SEACC opposes this Executive Order, which breaks key promises made to Alaskans when the Alaska State Forest System and the Bald Eagle Preserve were created. The Advisory Council, established by the legislature, is at the heart of informed stewardship and exists to ensure that Indigenous, local, scientific, and business knowledge of this place is central to the development and monitoring of the management plan for the Preserve.

In 1982 SEACC was part of the deal that established the Haines State Forest and the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve, resolving Governor Jay Hammond's freeze on development in the Chilkat Valley. This hard-won compromise plan included Schnabel Lumber Company, Haines area miners, the City and Borough of Haines, Lynn Canal Conservation, SEACC, and the National Audubon Society, who worked together to come



up with an enduring plan that would meet the needs of this unique place where thousands of bald eagles gather annually on the Council Grounds.

We ask the legislature to hold to its promise to Alaska and pass a Special Concurrent Resolution disapproving Executive Order 132.

Dear members of the Senate Resources committee,

The 1970s and 1980s were contentious times with Haines residents divided over logging in the Chilkat Valley. The concurrent establishment of the Haines State Forest and the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve in 1982 was the result of compromise, and ultimately, consensus among all interested citizens and user groups. These included conservationists, loggers, miners, fishermen, hunters, the Chilkoot Indian Association and the Chilkat Indian Village, Klukwan Inc, and the local, state, and federal governments. The result was a remarkable achievement.

Since its establishment, Haines residents have come to embrace and take pride in this unique Preserve and its protection of the bald eagle and the natural resources. The CBEP attracts global attention, great press, and has become an important economic driver.

The CBEP legislation included establishing a 12-member advisory group, with 6 Haines area representatives, with management responsibilities for the Preserve. Critically important is representation on the AC by both the Chilkat Indian Village and the Chilkoot Indian Association whose knowledge and experience from stewardship of their homelands for thousands of years is invaluable. Membership on the AC ensures that local Native people have an official voice in decision making that affects their traditional homelands.

The CBEP AC has successfully resolved Preserve issues since its establishment. Participation of the local appointees has provided critical knowledge resulting in efficient, effective, and respected decision making.

However for the last 3+ years, Governor Dunleavy has chosen not to appoint local representatives as required by law. He has purposefully undermined the function of the AC and disenfranchised the Native Tribal entities and all Haines citizens who depend on local AC representation to protect the integrity and health of Preserve resources including clean water, salmon, and wildlife.

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With no honest rationale for EO132, the Governor has chosen to destroy the heart of the 1982 CBEP legislation created by years of effort by Alaskan citizens. He has broken the hard won trust of the people of Haines and jeopardized the integrity of Preserve.

EO 132 would strip away any local control regarding Preserve management and replace it with informal advisory groups and traditional channels. DNR's explanations that it would create efficiency and a single point of contact for management, eliminate duplication within state government, and align management with that of other parks is inaccurate. The AC is already a single point of contact which includes all the local, state, and federal members essential for effective decision making. Creating multiple informal advisory groups is inefficient and duplicative.

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Concerning DNR's suggestion that sunseting the AC will align Preserve management with that of other parks, the 1982 legislation makes clear that the Preserve is a unique unit with unique protections and provisions, and was never intended to align with other state park units.

From Chapter 1, page 8 of the 2002 CBEP Management Plan from DNR: "When it established the Preserve, the legislature created a **new type of unit unlike any other in the state park system**. It required the protection of Preserve resources, especially those related to the Chilkat

bald eagles, their associated habitat, and the spawning and rearing areas of anadromous streams in the Chilkat and Chilkoot Rivers. **The provisions distinguishing the Preserve from other units of the state park system include** giving strong guarantees that traditional uses may continue; excluding from the Preserve private land, University lands, highway corridors, pipeline corridors, and municipal lands; treating Native allotments and pending Native allotments as private lands; giving strong guarantees of access across the Preserve; requiring the favorable consideration of utility corridors across the Preserve if they are compatible with the purposes of the Preserve; and, allowing municipal selections of land in the Preserve.”

There was no intention in the establishment of the Preserve that its management would in any way be aligned with that of DPOR’s park units. Was such even legal, the condition of the 4 Haines State Park units over the last 5 years would presage the same dismantling intended for the Preserve.

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If the Governor wants changes made to the CBEP Management Plan, they must be made by the Legislature to the legislation establishing the Preserve as noted in Chapter 4, page 10 of CBEP Management Plan, 2002, DNR. According to AS 41.21.620, plan revisions or amendments require the participation of the AC and include meetings with all interested groups and the general public to be held in the Village of Klukwan and the community of Haines, with public notice preceding each meeting.

In any case, the legislation establishing the CBEP includes:

Sec. 41.21.625. Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council.

(a) A 12-member Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council is established. The members of the advisory council shall be selected under this section.

**(b) The governor shall appoint individuals to the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council representing the following interests for a two-year term:**

- (1) a resident of the Haines Borough representing a conservation organization;
- (2) a representative of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service; and
- (3) a member of the Upper Lynn Canal fish and game advisory committee.

The 2002 CBEP Management Plan and AS 41.21.616-625 clearly delineate the following responsibilities required of the AC:

**DPOR is required to:**

- consult with the AC to determine if there is significant resource damage (ch.2, p7);
- notify the AC prior to issuing commercial permits (chapter 2, p 9);
- work with the Preserve Advisory Council on the development of policy guidelines and regulations dealing with the management of cabins (ch2, p10);
- provide to the AC any DPOR recommendations for the need of additional management controls for AC review and recommendations prior to enactment (ch3, p6);
- provide the AC the results of DPOR’s annual review for their review and recommendations (ch4, p9);
- notify the Council of commercial use applications for the forthcoming summer operating season by April 1st of that year so the AC can provide an advisory comment prior to DNR's decision on these applications (ch 4, p10);

**DNR requires** interagency and **AC review of proposed, significant modification of the Preserve Plan.** (CBEP Management Plan, 2002, ch4, p10-11)

\*the AC **shall** participate in the re-evaluation of the Preserve Plan. (AS 41.21.620)

\*the AC **shall** also participate in the plan revision.

\*the AC **shall** review any proposed amendments to the Preserve Plan.

- \*the AC **shall** review any proposed minor changes to the Preserve Plan.
- \*the AC will be given an opportunity to review the findings of any special exceptions to the Plan, and to appeal the findings.

**The AC's responsibilities outlined in AS 41.21.616-625 also include:**

- \*Review and comment on regulations proposed by the Department of Natural Resources governing public use and protection of Preserve resources, and comment on fish and game regulations proposed for adoption by the Board of Fisheries or the Board of Game. (41.21.616)
  - \*Review and comment on a finding by the Director that a traditional use is causing significant resource damage. (41.21.618)
  - \*Review and comment on regulations and stipulations established to protect purposes and values of the Preserve and to minimize adverse environmental impacts in the Preserve in the event of authorized access or egress across Preserve land. (41.21.619)
  - \*Use information from cooperative resource studies to comment on management decisions. (41.21.620(a))
  - \*Investigate the need for additional research. (41.21.620(a))
  - \*Receive notice of proposed additions to or deletions from the Preserve. (41.21.621)
  - \*Assist the Department in monitoring the management plan. (41.21.625(e))
  - \*Review commercial use permits before the start of an upcoming operating season.
- (ch4,p2)

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If it ain't broke, don't fix it.

The 1982 Preserve legislation is a masterful document and the AC has been an effective and inexpensive problem solver up until Governor Dunleavy chose to dismantle it.

Please reject Executive Order 132 by passing a Special Concurrent Resolution protecting the integrity of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council.

Also, please request the Governor fulfill his responsibility to appoint the 3 Haines seats asap as required by law so that the AC can resume its work.

Senators:

The Haines Borough is unified in opposition to Governor Michael Dunleavy's executive action that would eliminate the advisory council of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve.

For 40 years, the council has worked well for our community, allowing us to hash out preserve management questions and issues using local expertise, then forwarding our resulting recommendations to state managers for a final decision.

The council system, in this way, saves the State of Alaska money and time that would otherwise be spent by state staffers in Juneau, trying to acquire information and perspectives from various individuals in our borough previous to decision-making.

Further, the creation of the preserve and its 12-member advisory council 40 years ago resulted from a hard-fought, multi-partnered agreement that struck a balance between traditional uses of this 48,000 acres of eagle habitat and the necessary protection of the world's largest gathering of eagles.

That balance remains to this day largely due to the cooperative, goodwill efforts of government officials and public users represented on the advisory council.

For these reasons, the borough requests a special concurrent resolution on this matter and a vote on this executive order (#132) in a joint session of the Alaska Legislature.

Dear Senator Giessel:

I watched the entire Senate Resources Committee meeting today and was the last person called to testify.

Apparently when my name was called watching live, the meeting was actually over and I couldn't get through on my phone.

The following is my testimony in writing:

Please share with the rest of the Committee.

Thank you, Senators, for holding this hearing. My name is Kathleen Menke.

It was a trip on the ferry to visit the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve one rainy October back in the mid-1990s that led me to purchase my forested lot here in Haines/Deishu. Over the past 28 years I have cleared my land, worked multiple jobs in Haines, and built my home on this lot out-of-pocket.

Over those 28 years, I attended numerous meetings of the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council that has been in existence for over 42 years. The meetings of the Council were regularly scheduled, every two months, and open to the public for local input. With Council and public input, the Preserve Management Plan of 2002, available online, was updated.

The mission of the Preserve, created by Governor Hammond and encoded in statute, is to protect one of the largest gatherings of bald eagles in the world and the fisheries on which these eagles, other wildlife, and people depend for their healthy food and traditional lifestyles. Lands with the Preserve include acerages within both the Chilkat and Chilkoot watersheds that are critical salmon spawning grounds on which our national symbol the bald eagle depends.

Your legislative attorney in his memo to Sen. Stevens stated that when an Executive Order might be contrary to the law which originally set up this department or board, that part of his executive order would have to be disapproved by a legislature. That situation certainly applies here.

The Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is world renown and brings a big boost to the State economy of Alaska. There is no other place in Alaska like it. It is unique and deserves a legislative override to retain local public input for its management and protection.

The Alaska statute creating the Advisory Council defines the 12-board seats of the Council, including local ADFG, State Parks and Forestry representatives, along with representatives of the Haines Borough, the Chilkat Indian Village, Klukwan Inc., Chilkoot Indian Association and representatives of local conservation and business and commerce groups and the Upper Lynn Canal Fish and Game Advisory Committee, and the US Fish and Wildlife Service.



Governor Dunleavy failed to consult the communities of Haines and Klukwan on this Executive Order, including apparently his own state employees who sit on this Council and have since been told that they work for the governor and it is their job to support the governor and not comment on this action. Why would our legislators allow this kind of action by the Governor that disregards and disrespects even his own State employees?

I'm asking you to overturn the governor's Executive Order that eliminates the Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council. I have participated in most of the Council's meetings over the last six years, and I value them for the information I receive there, and for the regular opportunity to engage with management concerns. The Eagle Preserve is important to our local communities for our fisheries, tourism, recreation, cultural, and subsistence activities. The preserve supports numerous local businesses, and the broader Alaska economy.

Beyond the benefits of the preserve itself, our local community depends on the Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council for opportunities to participate in the management of the preserve, and to stay informed about activities that affect the preserve and our day-to-day lives. I am Joseph Ordonez, resident of Haines, Alaska. I am the author of the book, *Where Eagles Gather, the Story of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve, Haines, Alaska*. I have been guiding the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve since 1987. I own a tour company, Rainbow Glacier Adventures, that operates rafting and photography tours in the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve.

The Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is where the Eagle Council Grounds are located. The November convocation of thousands of American Bald Eagles there is one of the most amazing wildlife gatherings in the world. Travelers and photographers come from all over the world to witness the spectacle.

The history of the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is one of conflict and compromise. Back in the 1980's, the area where the eagles gather was slated for logging. The proposed logging activity threatened the salmon habitat, and consequently threatened the bald eagles. The conflict intensified, and at one point, there was serious consideration of making the Bald Eagle Council Grounds an extension of Glacier Bay National Park. Logging, mining, recreation, conservation and native groups all had strong and opposing opinions on what should be done. Things got heated in Haines. Governor Jay Hammond told the local people to work out their differences, or he would figure out a solution for them.

The locals were very concerned about the Federal Government moving into the area, and decided upon a compromise- an Eagle Preserve. This was an entirely new concept. Not a State Park- but a Preserve, where large-scale threats (like logging and mining) would be disallowed but traditional activities (like fishing, berry picking, hunting and recreational uses) would be allowed.

With the new entity of an "eagle preserve," there were bound to be issues that would require additional research and discussion. And the locals insisted that they did not want to be left out. After all, they had worked together to create the preserve, they wanted to have a say in managing the preserve.

Rather than outsourcing all the research and discussion to the Federal Government or the State, one of the core values that the Preserve was founded on was ***including and valuing local input***.

The local input was enshrined with the creation of the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Board. This ensured that local stakeholders were involved in decision-making that affected the Preserve.

This Advisory Board has fulfilled its mission for the last forty years, and dealt with a variety of thorny issues. The State Park Ranger is the one who traditionally calls the meeting for the Board. Recently, there has been no State Park Ranger in Haines and the Board failed to meet.

The Governor has stated that eliminating the Advisory Board will increase efficiency. Democracy is not the most efficient method of making decisions. But it is the most fair.

Why eliminate the Advisory Board? Why fear the Advisory Board? The Advisory Board does not cost the State any money. Bringing in local people with a variety of expertise and opinions together to work out the management of public land is not something to be feared.

It is something to be celebrated.

Please reject EO 132.

Honorable Members of the Resources Committee,

I was the Lead Park Ranger in Haines from 1977-1983 and I was in the room when language for the bill that created the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve was developed. It was an endeavor that brought all factions together to solve the deadlock over logging in the Chilkat Valley. The key to the agreement was the inclusion of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Advisory Council. Without the establishment of the Council the federal government, miners, loggers, fishermen, hunters, local, state and regional environmental groups, and Chilkat and Chilkoot people would not have reached agreement on establishing the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve and the Haines State Forest, enabling logging to recommence and loggers and mill workers to go back to work in the Chilkat Valley. It was an awesome accomplishment. After I moved to Juneau as SE Regional Manager for Alaska State Parks I continued to fly to Haines for monthly Advisory Board meetings. Each member took their role seriously and played a part in ensuring fair, effective and environmentally responsible management of the Preserve.

I never imagined that a Governor would try to dismantle something that was a promise, a contract with the people, for how the land would be managed.

My hope is that the Legislature will protect the intent of the original legislation that was built on broad community engagement and trust.

Because of the unique attributes of the area, state law requires the Departments of Natural Resources and Fish and Game to consult with the council before adopting regulations affecting traditional uses, fish and game management, and public use and protection of the Preserve. This is the process which will be protected by rejection of the Governor's Executive Order.

I am Joseph Ordonez, resident of Haines, Alaska. I am the author of the book, *Where Eagles Gather, the Story of the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve, Haines, Alaska*. I have been guiding the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve since 1987. I own a tour company, Rainbow Glacier Adventures, that operates rafting and photography tours in the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve.

The Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is where the Eagle Council Grounds are located. The November convocation of thousands of American Bald Eagles there is one of the most amazing wildlife gatherings in the world. Travelers and photographers come from all over the world to witness the spectacle.

The history of the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve is one of conflict and compromise. Back in the 1980's, the area where the eagles gather was slated for logging. The proposed logging activity threatened the salmon habitat, and consequently threatened the bald eagles. The conflict intensified, and at one point, there was serious consideration of making the Bald Eagle Council Grounds an extension of Glacier Bay National Park. Logging, mining, recreation, conservation and native groups all had strong and opposing opinions on what should be done. Things got heated in Haines. Governor Jay Hammond told the local people to work out their differences, or he would figure out a solution for them.

The locals were very concerned about the Federal Government moving into the area, and decided upon a compromise- an Eagle Preserve. This was an entirely new concept. Not a State Park- but a Preserve, where large-scale threats (like logging and mining) would be disallowed but traditional activities (like fishing, berry picking, hunting and recreational uses) would be allowed.

With the new entity of an "eagle preserve," there were bound to be issues that would require additional research and discussion. And the locals insisted that they did not want to be left out. After all, they had worked together to create the preserve, they wanted to have a say in managing the preserve.

Rather than outsourcing all the research and discussion to the Federal Government or the State, one of the core values that the Preserve was founded on was ***including and valuing local input***.

The local input was enshrined with the creation of the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Board. This ensured that local stakeholders were involved in decision-making that affected the Preserve.

This Advisory Board has fulfilled its mission for the last forty years, and dealt with a variety of thorny issues. The State Park Ranger is the one who traditionally calls the meeting for the Board. Recently, there has been no State Park Ranger in Haines and the Board failed to meet.

The Governor has stated that eliminating the Advisory Board will increase efficiency. Democracy is not the most efficient method of making decisions. But it is the most fair.

Why eliminate the Advisory Board? Why fear the Advisory Board? The Advisory Board does not cost the State any money. Bringing in local people with a variety of expertise and opinions together to work out the management of public land is not something to be feared.

It is something to be celebrated.

I request that the Senate pass a resolution overturning EO 132. Please retain the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council (AC).

The Eagle Preserve is not a park. It is a preserve created for a very specific purpose. The Preserve AC is made up of representatives of entities with interests in the Preserve - interests that DNR does not otherwise represent. This is quite different from a citizen board to provide input on uses of a park.

The Preserve AC advises DNR on important issues, including eagles, fish, wildlife, water quality, subsistence, and other areas mandated explicitly for protection in the Preserve. The Preserve AC assists the State in making its decisions, provides representation of vested and legal interests and helps to ensure a fully informed State agency by contributing local experience and knowledge.

Preserve-related issues, sometimes the source of great conflict, can be worked out between user groups at AC meetings. Resolving these questions locally means less need for state involvement, and forms a basis for governance responsive to local needs and concerns.

EO 132 does not serve the needs of local residents who are dependent on the subsistence and economic resources that the Eagle Preserve provides. **Please accept these comments from the Upper Lynn Canal Fish and Game Advisory Committee regarding Governor Dunleavy's Executive Order 132 abolishing the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council.**

We believe that Executive Order 132 is not in the State's best interests and will significantly impact important local natural resource values in the area, specifically fish and wildlife.

We are concerned that these impacts have not been investigated or assessed and that the timeline for rectifying the Governor's action is short. We request that the Senate and House pass a concurrent resolution overturning EO 132 and, therefore, retain the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve Advisory Council (Preserve AC).

The Alaska Legislature designated the Preserve AC 42 years ago to work with the Division of Parks to develop the management plan for the Preserve and make decisions affecting the management and administration of the Preserve (AS 41.21.620). The Upper Lynn Canal Fish and Game Advisory Committee has valuable information to contribute to the decision-making process of the Preserve, and our ability to directly provide this information to the Preserve AC would be eliminated if EO 132 is implemented.

The Preserve AC comprises representatives of entities with legal and/or vested interest in the Preserve – interests that DNR does not otherwise represent. Besides a member of the Upper Lynn Canal Fish and Game Advisory Committee, Preserve AC members include several with significant roles and responsibilities not ordinarily considered by the Division of Parks. These include a representative of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service; the Mayor of the Haines Borough; the President of Klukwan, Inc.; the Chair of the Council of the Chilkat Indian Village; the Chair of the Chilkoot Indian Association; a member of the Haines Borough Assembly; the Commissioner of Fish and Game; the Director of the Division of Parks; the Director of the Division of Forestry; a resident of the Haines Borough representing a conservation organization; and a resident of the Haines Borough appointed for the representation of commercial or industrial interests.

The Preserve AC advises DNR on issues where the Division of Parks has no jurisdiction, staff, or expertise, including fish, wildlife, eagles, water quality, subsistence, and other

areas mandated explicitly for protection in the Preserve. The Preserve AC's purpose is to assist the State in making its decisions and ensure representation of vested and legal interests. The Preserve AC exists to ensure a fully informed State agency.

The Legislature established the Preserve AC to preclude the conflicts that divided Haines for many years prior to the passage of the statutes governing the Preserve. The Preserve AC provides a crucial formal meeting space for Preserve-related issues to be worked out between user groups, resulting in less need for State involvement and oversight. When local problems can be solved locally, it provides for efficient, transparent, responsive, and appropriate governance.

The Upper Lynn Canal Fish and Game Advisory Committee is concerned that the loss of the Preserve AC will deprive the Preserve managers of the local expertise and guidance provided by volunteers serving on the AC. Such local knowledge cannot be replaced by DNR acting from a distance to manage the Preserve.

The Upper Lynn Canal Fish and Game Advisory Committee finds that EO 132 does not serve the needs of local residents who are dependent upon the subsistence and economic resources that the Eagle Preserve provides. The resources being impacted by EO 132 are very important to the people of Haines, Klukwan, and the Chilkat and Klehini Valleys. More than 91% of local families utilize subsistence foods. Hunting, fishing, and spending time on the water and the land are the basis of local culture. Local fish and wildlife users deserve to be consulted whenever our State agencies make important decisions.

Removing the Preserve AC removes the generations of wisdom, knowledge, and commitment to resource sustainability provided by those local AC voices. The local economy, more broadly, has become dependent on the Preserve, making the voices of the Preserve AC crucial for responsible economic development within and around the Preserve.

The Preserve AC provides local people the means to work with the Division of Parks on questions relating to the Preserve resources for food security and the economy. Traditionally the Preserve AC meets locally, is chaired by the Haines Borough Mayor, and is open to the public. It provides an important forum for public input. If EO 132 goes into effect, this effective community voice would be lost.

My name is Peter Goll. I was the state representative for Haines and Klukwan from 1983 – 1991. Before my election in 1982, I was consulted during development of the Haines State Forest and Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve legislation by Governor Hammond and Senator Bill Ray.

As a legislator I worked with Governor Sheffield and Commissioner Wunnicke as they developed the first management plans for the State Forest and Bald Eagle Preserve. For eight years, I followed their management as a Legislator, and then privately thereafter.

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I believe the deletion of the Advisory Council exceeds the authority of the Executive Branch, and would create additional management costs, reduce efficiency and responsiveness of State government, and will conflict with clear legislative intent.

Executive Order 132 is not a reorganization of the administrative functions of the Division of Parks.

It is the elimination of an independent legislatively-created advisory body with a specific set of statutory purposes defined by law.

EO 132 will reduce administrative efficiency by increasing DNR's research burden, and significantly increase agency and municipal costs whenever a controversial issue arises in the Preserve.

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Issues do arise in the Preserve; and many have been resolved each year by the Council for the cost of a teleconference at most. This compares well to the years before adoption of the statute, when disputes related to State land management cost the State and local governments many hundreds of thousands of dollars, and destroyed community life for years with months of angry public meetings.

Furthermore, of great importance: Two recognized tribal governments have vested interests in Preserve and its subsistence resources.

*The Council provides the only place at the table for the Chilkat Indian Village - Klukwan and for the tribal government of the Chilkoot people, the Chilkoot Indian Association to formally comment on the course of day to day management. The Act guarantees customary and traditional use protection.*

These tribal governments have significant legal interests in the subsistence resources and activities protected by the Preserve, but are *only consulted officially regarding ongoing management through this committee.*

The same is true of US Fish and Wildlife Service and the *Haines Borough, both with vested responsibilities in the Preserve.* Like the Chilkat Indian Village, the Borough and USFWS may be consulted *when regulations are changed, but have no official standing at other times.*

Eliminating a Council that ensures a formal role for the tribes and other governmental entities with an interest in this unit, is a passport back to the long and acrimonious disputes of the past. The EO should be rejected.

The inconvenience of having an advisory council is small compared to the time and money saved on issues that - without it - would lead to disputes, months of costly public meetings, and litigation.

State officials who had to address upper Lynn Canal community and resource issues in the late and controversial 1970's can quantify the savings this Council provides compared to managing the political conflicts that disturbed Agency operations in the past. The Governor and Legislature viewed the Council as a cost-saving measure to promote government efficiency and support quality management.

The Preserve bill and its Advisory Council received an extraordinary amount of legislative research, public comment, and line-by-line review from State, Municipal, Tribal and Federal entities, as well attention from industrial, fisheries, subsistence, environmental and other vested interests. It implements clear Legislative intent.

The Advisory Committee's duty is to give formal advice through the Division of Parks, and is an independent advisory entity for the benefit of the state.

The Legislature mandated this avenue for input to ensure successful operation of a Preserve over time, and avoid arbitrary or political policy changes in an area requiring perpetual protection under law.

The advisory committee is a safe and inexpensive resource for the Division to ensure responsive management. It is the only deliberative body that incorporates all relevant legal, vested interests in the Preserve. It works to support the official management tasks of DNR, but does not assume any Division duties.

Committee minutes from 1981 -2 will demonstrate a clear understanding of the need for the Council to ensure successful implementation of the Preserve as a preserve and traditional use area, over time. The Preserve is not a park like other parks. It is a special use area with a dedicated purpose, removed from multiple use and requiring a unique management approach.

Trying to align Preserve management with the practices in other Parks, the stated goal of the Division, is contrary to Legislative intent. The residents of the valley use this area for their sustenance and have been adamant, and the Legislature has understood that the Preserve is a special purpose site to protect certain species and traditional uses, and is not a park in the conventional sense of the word.

I urge you to reject EO 132 in behalf of efficiency, legality and to protect the legitimate state, local, municipal and tribal interests that are represented on the Council.

Regarding the various legal entities involved.

Tribal, local government, state and federal agency consensus through the Council is necessary for the Division of Parks to successfully navigate overlapping jurisdictions and complex, sometimes competing vested interests.

For example, the Preserve is on the State land that surrounds the subsistence-dependent Chilkat village of Klukwan, which is a federal law municipality, not a subdivision of the State or Haines Borough.

The surrounding Preserve however is part of the Haines Borough whose residents depend upon Preserve resources for their economic needs.

The State must also address the protected uses by the Chilkoot people whose tribal government is the Chilkoot Indian Association.

Though the Preserve exists under State law to protect the Bald Eagle, this species is technically under federal management.

The Council is not part of the internal administration of Division of Parks. It is an appointed body of key vested, legal interests in a land unit.

It is a discreet advisory entity created with Legislative forethought and purpose. It serves the State, municipal, Tribal and public interest and is worthy of protection.

When local problems can be solved locally, it provides for efficient, transparent, responsive, and appropriate governance.

The Upper Lynn Canal Fish and Game Advisory Committee is concerned that the loss of the Preserve AC will deprive the Preserve managers of the local expertise and guidance provided by volunteers serving on the AC. Such local knowledge cannot be replaced by DNR acting from a distance to manage the Preserve.

The Upper Lynn Canal Fish and Game Advisory Committee finds that EO 132 does not serve the needs of local residents who are dependent upon the subsistence and economic resources that the Eagle Preserve provides. The resources being impacted by EO 132 are very important to the people of Haines, Klukwan, and the Chilkat and Klehini Valleys. More than 91% of local families utilize subsistence foods. Hunting, fishing, and spending time on the water and the land are the basis of local culture. Local fish and wildlife users deserve to be consulted whenever our State agencies make important decisions.

Removing the Preserve AC removes the generations of wisdom, knowledge, and commitment to resource sustainability provided by those local AC voices. The local economy, more broadly, has become dependent on the Preserve, making the voices of the Preserve AC crucial for responsible economic development within and around the Preserve.

The Preserve AC provides local people the means to work with the Division of Parks on questions relating to the Preserve resources for food security and the economy. Traditionally the Preserve AC meets locally, is chaired by the Haines Borough Mayor, and is open to the public. It provides an important forum for public input. If EO 132 goes into effect, this effective community voice would be lost.

**The Preserve AC is our local voice. Please retain the Preserve AC through a concurrent resolution overturning EO 132.**
