Sponsor Statement

"An Act establishing the Alaska Military Affairs Commission; and relating to the duties and powers of the Alaska Military Affairs Commission."

Senate Bill No. 185 establishes the Alaska Military Affairs Commission (AMAC). AMAC will effectively provide recommendations and counsel regarding social, economic and industrial development concerning the military to the Governor, agencies, the legislature, communities, and our congressional delegation. The AMAC will work on the expansion of military presence in our state, including, but not limited to, new bases, increased training, and expanded missions.

Various states across the country have established military affairs organizations focused on the growth and preservation of their defense sectors. The defense industry has long been a vital component of Alaska's socioeconomic landscape. Despite its vitality, there are many gaps in the understanding of how the military impacts Alaska and a lack of opportunities for pursuing growth as defense priorities continue to evolve.
