### Analysis

This bill would remove the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development State Medical Board's need to approve newly established medical review committees and committee members. The Chief Medical Officer in the Department of Health would approve newly established morbidity and mortality review committees and committee members.

It is anticipated that there would be no fiscal impact on the Department of Health by this bill, therefore this is a zero fiscal note.
