Minimum Qualifications	High School Diploma or GED AND Must be 20 years of age or Older	A high school diploma or GED. AND Six months of experience, paid or volunteer, teaching or coaching group activities for youth. AND Must be 20 years of age or older. OR Six months of experience as a Juvenile Justice Counselor 1 with the State of Alaska. AND Demonstrated achievement of department approved performance standards. OR Six months of experience administering, advising on, performing, or supervising corrections, law enforcement, parole, probation, residential treatment casework, or social casework. Substitutions: Completed coursework from an accredited college may substitute for the required work experience (3 semester hours or 4 quarter hours equal one month of work experience). AND/OR Military experience may substitute for the required work experience on a month for month basis.	One year of experience performing the full range of treatment and security functions in a juvenile justice facility. The required experience is met by service as a Juvenile Justice Counselor 2 with the State of Alaska, or the equivalent elsewhere. OR One year of experience administering, advising on, performing, or supervising adult or juvenile corrections, law enforcement, parole, probation, residential treatment casework, or social casework. OR One year of experience performing the full range of duties associated with the custody, security, and reformation of prisoners in an adult correctional institution. The required experience is met by service as a Correctional Officer 2 with the State of Alaska, or the equivalent elsewhere.

Prior to initial appointment, successful candidates for the Juvenile Justice Counselor are subject to a background investigation, criminal record check, and medical examination to determine the essential duties of the position can be safely performed.

A valid driver's license is required at the time of appointment.
