Analysis

This bill directs the department to create a new position to coordinate charter school policy and procedures (AS 14.03.256). This position will track historical and current charter school activity, regulations, and policy, as well as coordinating with the Association of Alaska School Boards (AASB) to support charter school academic policy committees and local school boards.

The cost of the charter school coordinator will be \$186.4 for the first year. This includes an Education Specialist I (Range 21 Step C/D \$148.9), travel to attend AASB trainings and convenings as well as to assist districts as needed (\$10.0), chargebacks (\$16.5), one-time charge to commodities for supplies and equipment (\$5.0), and a one-time charge for regulation work with the Department of Law (\$6.0). The fiscal impact for the second year will be \$175.4 (salary, travel, and chargebacks).

In addition, the bill directs the department to provide school districts with \$500 per student in grades kindergarten through grade 3 who are determined to have a reading deficiency based on the statewide screening or assessment tool (AS 14.30.773). These funds are to be used to provide support, intervention, and services the students need for the student's improvement plan. This also includes any professional development the educators need.

The fiscal impact for funding districts with \$500 per student that were determined to have a reading deficiency would be \$5,177.5 (10,355 K-3 students x 500). The number of students was projected by using the Middle of the Year Literacy Screener data for the 2023-2024 school year shown below:
