House Bill 89 Fact Sheet: Gun Violence Protective Orders

WHAT THE BILL DOES: House Bill 89 creates a system for Gun Violence Protective Orders (GVPOs) so a household member or peace officer can petition the court for temporary removal of firearms when a person is a danger to themselves or others. During the time the GVPO is in effect the person may not possess, own, purchase, or receive a firearm.

Gun Violence Protective Orders are:

Temporary in nature, from 3 days to 6 months

Limited in scope to a crisis situation where a person is a danger to themselves or others

House Bill 89 creates three types of Protective Orders: Gun Violence Protective Order, an *Ex Parte* Gun Violence Protective Order, and an Emergency Gun Violence Protective Order.

SURRENDER OF FIREARMS: The respondent must surrender to a local law enforcement agency or sell to a firearms dealer all firearms and ammunition that the person possesses, owns, or has within the respondent's custody or control within 24 hours of receipt of the protective order.

RETURN OF FIREARMS: When the protective order expires, the law enforcement agency shall return the firearms or ammunition to the respondent. Prior to being returned, any firearms or ammunition surrendered to a law enforcement agency shall be retained by the law enforcement agency until the expiration of the gun violence protective order.
