Analysis

This bill establishes a Driving While Under the Influence (DUI) Diversion Program in Alaska. This program offers eligible first-time DUI offenders an opportunity to avoid a criminal conviction by completing a structured diversion program.
The bill requires the court to notify the Department of Administration of the diversion agreement, and the department is required to maintain a copy of every diversion agreement entered into by an individual under the DUI Diversion Program. The bill is silent on whether the Department of Administration is required to take any additional or special licensing action on the agreements.
The Department of Public Safety manages the Alaska Public Safety Information Network (APSIN) which is the state's law enforcement database for tracking criminal justice information, including driver's license status and restrictions. If the Department of Administration adds restrictions to a person's driver's license as a result of the DUI Diversion Program that are unique due to the program, the APSIN system may also need to be updated/reprogrammed to display those changes to law enforcement if they need to be displayed in a format different from current license restrictions, if they will have a unique status, or if restrictions need to be omitted from being displayed. At this time, a zero fiscal note is submitted.
