Analysis

This bill amends existing health education law, AS 14.30.360, health education curriculum; physical activity guidelines, by specifically adding mental health education to the statute. This bill allows for students to receive on-going education on mental health by:

- 1) explicitly adding mental health and physical health to the list of health topics, and encouraging school districts to include mental health in their kindergarten through 12th grade health education programs, and
- 2) requiring the State Board of Education and Early Development to provide school districts with health education guidelines for instruction in mental health that are developed in consultation with the Department of Health, the Department of Family and Community Services, and representatives of national and state health organizations. The mental health guidelines are to be developed within two years of the effective date.

This bill also instructs the department's report to the legislature to include a copy of the developed guidelines and the process used to develop them.

The fiscal note includes the following one-time expenses:

- 1) \$120.0 for 30 committee members to travel twice a year for in-person convenings (\$2.0 per participant);
- 2) \$36.0 for services including \$30.0 to hire a facilitator to oversee implementation and professional development for educators and \$6.0 for legal fees to implement the necessary regulation changes; and
- 3) \$60.0 for committee member stipends (\$2.0 per participant).

HB105 directs local school boards to work with school faculty and parents to develop a policy that would provide protification at least two weeks before any class or program that provides instruction in mental health. This bill furt modifies AS 14.30.360 to include mental health curricula in their current health education programs.	
The State Board of Education would be required to establish guidelines surrounding these curricula with consultation the Department of Health, the Department of Family and Community Services, regional tribal health organizations, representatives of national and state mental health organizations. The Department of Family and Community Services would be required when called upon to provide technical assistance to school districts in developing the curricula mentioned previously. Lastly this bill requires that the Board of Education and Early Development submit a report to legislature that includes a copy of the guidelines developed, and describing the process the Board used to develop guidelines.	and ices to the
