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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This bill amends the procedures for incorporation of boroughs through the legislative review process. The legislative review process specifies that election procedures do not apply. This legislation adds the requirement that the Local Boundary Commission (LBC) must hold at least two public hearings in the proposed area of incorporation and “determine that a majority of residents of voting age within the area support the proposal.”

The bill will require changes to LBC processes and staff activities regarding public notice, public meetings, and public comment; as well as travel to the location of the hearing, therefore Division of Community and Regional Affairs is projecting the following additional costs if this bill is adopted:

Travel: \$15.0 Two trips per year for five commissioners, estimated at \$1.5 for each trip
