At the age of 32 Dr Jensen became America's youngest medical school CEO when he was appointed President of the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine. He has since become the only person to serve as president or senior executive at colleges of osteopathic medicine (3), allopathic medicine (2), naturopathic medicine (2), east Asian medicine (1) and chiropractic (1). He is regarded as the only person to have led conventional and complementary colleges of health sciences. When testifying at legislative and other health policy hearings, Dr Jensen often describes his awareness of the curricula in diverse healthcare professions. Dr Jensen is currently a professor of pharmacology and interprofessional education at Rocky Vista University College of Osteopathic Medicine.
