Funds will continue to support a long-term non-permanent position within the DEED to provide services to staff and coaching to school districts. Data related to the COVID-19 pandemic indicates a significant need for student and family mental health support and indicates schools as critical infrastructure for providing that support now and into the future. Teachers and faculty in all Alaska school districts, and particularly those smaller districts with fewer mental health resources, have expressed a need for increased mental health support as schools operate in a post-pandemic environment. The DEED staff will work collaboratively with the Trust, Department of Health (DOH), and other partners to promote the expansion of behavioral health supports in schools through a long-term, non-permanent behavioral health specialist position embedded within the DEED. The position will continue to work closely with under-resourced and rural districts that have identified the need for and interest in enhancing access to student behavioral health supports. The behavioral health specialist position will provide direct support to staff to support students in rural districts and will inform the Trust and advisory board of efforts to expand behavioral health student supports statewide. Additionally, this position supports rural school counselors and social workers through a facilitated monthly meeting. Presentations are provided during some of these meetings and are based on the expressed needs of the group. Topics that have been presented include (but are not limited to) parental involvement, student motivation, problem behavior management, students on the autism spectrum, and termination of care during the summer. A core component of this support includes PBIS and trauma-engaged coaching and training. Finally, this position provides continuous support to cover the health and safety needs identified in schools, including crisis response. Trust advisory boards and multiple partners have identified this project as a high priority and key COVID-19 response and recovery project.
