Analysis

This bill amends AS 14.17.430, State funding for correspondence study, by removing the 90 percent multiplier for correspondence program average daily membership (ADM). The change would increase the projected FY2025 State aid to school districts with a correspondence program by \$13,064.4.

This bill increases the base student allocation (BSA) under AS 14.17.470 by \$680, from \$5,960 to \$6,640 (whole dollars). The \$680 BSA increase results in a projected increase in State aid funding to school districts of \$176,120.1 in FY2025.

This bill takes effect July 1, 2024 (FY2025).

The funding mechanism is a general fund transfer to the Public Education Fund (PEF). The fiscal note effect for FY2025 through FY2030 is reported in the fiscal note for the PEF, as the funding is deposited to the PEF, not into the Foundation Program funding component. The above analysis is presented here for explanation purposes only.
