\$1,498,200 has been appropriated for Independent Living centers that currently exist in the state. These centers are community-based, cross-disability, non-profit organizations that are designed and operated by people with disabilities. These are essential for seniors all across the state who need care and want to receive assistance in living independently.

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Support of existing Adult Day grantees and the expansion and development of Adult Day Services in underserved areas is needed to provide respite for unpaid caregivers and financial stabilization for families while Alaska's population ages. Expenditure data from FY21 to FY23 reflects positive cost trends, with the per-hour cost decreasing from \$40 to \$18. The State of Alaska can build on its efficiency by allocating this funding, enabling ADS grantees to serve more Alaskans, especially those who do not qualify for Medicaid. Additionally, this funding would facilitate the financial recovery of adult day centers still grappling with the aftermath of COVID-19 complications.

This funding is needed to elevate the current federal investment in Alaska's child care system. Under current funding levels, over 148 child care programs have already closed which has reduced access for 100s of families across the state. What this appropriation would do is:

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Support Small Child Care Businesses (\$15.5 million)- 20% of Alaska's child care programs have closed in the last four years, impacting economic activity by approximately \$180 million.

Develop the Child Care Workforce (\$8 million)- The average child care worker makes \$29,500 a year. The average wage is less than gas station attendants and includes few workplace benefits.

Support Families Seeking Child Care (\$7 million)- 515 of Alaskan families are not participating in the workforce to the extent they would like due to the lack of child care. On average, Alaska's families pay 15%-35% of their income for child care.

It is the intent of the legislature that the department raise the \$18,500 per project cap for environmental modifications to \$40,000 per project, exclusive of shipping costs to remote communities, and extend the project timeline limit from 90 days to 270 days better reflect the true cost and time challenges of providing Environmental Modifications Services (E-Mods Program) in remote, rural areas of Alaska.

Explanation

The legislature is expressing its intent for the department to seek and secure approval from CMS to update its Environmental Modification Services Conditions of Participation and related state regulations of the Medicaid waiver environmental modifications program to reflect the actual costs and time constraints of projects. Any future E-Mod Program funding will still be subject to appropriation.

If the Bar Association, the ACLU, the Chamber of Commerce or any other group of citizens wish to engage in this campaign, that is appropriate, but it is not appropriate for the Government to weigh in.
