- WHEREAS,** in more than 200 years since the birth of the United States, more than 1,000,000 servicemen and women have sacrificed their lives for our country; and
- WHEREAS,** there has never been a symbol to recognize those men and women who have lost their lives while serving in the armed forces; and
- WHEREAS,** Honor and Remember, Inc. has created a flag to honor the selfless sacrifice made by those fallen, and to remember each of them by name; and
- WHEREAS,** the red field on the flag represents the blood spilled by brave men and women in America's military, throughout our history; and
- WHEREAS,** the blue star represents active service in military conflict, through all generations from the American Revolution to the present day; and
- WHEREAS,** the white border surrounding the gold star recognizes the purity of sacrifice, as there is no greater price an American can pay than to give his or her life in service to our country; and
- WHEREAS,** the gold star signifies the ultimate sacrifice of a warrior in active service who will not return home; and
- WHEREAS,** the folded flag signifies the final tribute to an individual life that a family sacrificed and gave to the nation; and
- WHEREAS,** the flame is an eternal reminder of the spirit that has departed this life yet burns on in the memory of all who knew and loved the fallen soldier; and
- WHEREAS,** the Honor and Remember Flag will serve as a symbol of national gratitude for all members of the armed forces who have sacrificed their lives for our freedoms and will serve as a daily reminder to acknowledge the ultimate price of freedom,

giving comfort to the loved ones who have lost someone during military service for our country; and

**WHEREAS,** House Joint Resolution 53 has been introduced in the Twenty-Sixth Legislature of Alaska to support United States Congressional Bill H.R. 1034, designating the Honor and Remember Flag as an official symbol to recognize and honor members of the Armed Forces who died in the line of duty;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:**


**SECTION 1.** That the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly supports House Joint Resolution 53 of the Twenty-Sixth Alaska Legislature, designating the Honor and Remember Flag as a unifying symbol to recognize and honor all members of the Armed Forces of the United States who died in the line of duty and urging Congress to pass H.R. 1034.



WHEREAS, the eternal flame element on the flag symbolizes the spirit that lives on in memory of the departed; and,

WHEREAS, support of H.R. 1034 identifies a unifying symbol to recognize this Nation's solemn debt to honor the selfless sacrifice and remember individually by name, the estimated 1.6 million fallen servicepersons throughout history, and the families and communities who mourn their loss.
